FOREWORD

The Government of Sikkim has accorded highest priority to the education sector by providing an outlay of almost 20% of the State's budget and records have shown that much progress has been achieved, manifesting in remarkable performances by our students who have qualified for many competitive examinations, acquired doctoral and post doctoral degrees and are successfully employed in other parts of the country and abroad.

Jointly managed at the national and state levels, many initiatives have been undertaken to improve access to quality schooling-particularly for those who are economically and socially disadvantaged. With thriving competition from private schools there have been clear efforts within the government sector to offer parents and children what they most need and want: quality education leading to improved life opportunities.

Education per se has numerous indicators wherein 'values' is of prime importance. Apart from academic excellence, our children have been taught to respect women and elders, maintain peace and harmony, show concern for the environment, maintain cleanliness, be of help to the society, organize yoga and self defence (for girls) program at various schools along with the training of School Managing Committees and programs of community mobilization.

Governmental interventions have been successful in acquiring accreditation for six Sikkim Government Colleges by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) which has been a major achievement for the Directorate of Higher Education.

The project Samagra Shiksha has brought back most of the out of school children back into the school system while incentives like the mid day meal scheme free uniforms, text books, rain-coat, shoes and socks distribution have helped retain students in the school system. This scheme has added infrastructural support to accommodate a larger number of students in schools. It also has components relating to education of differently-abled children.

Taking all the above approaches in pursuance to the education policy, various steps have also been taken by the government in the year 2019-20 to especially facilitate the teaching learning process. The Education Department on its part has taken up the policies of the government for implementation in the year 2019-20. As such this report is a compilation of activities pertaining to various sections of the department.

CHAPTER-1 ELEMENTARY EDUCATION AND SAMAGRA SHIKSHA

Samagra Shiksha is an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from preschool to class 12 and has been, therefore, prepared with the broader goal of improving school effectiveness measured in terms of equal opportunities for schooling and equitable learning outcomes. It subsumes the three erstwhile Schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE).

Major Objectives and Goal of the Scheme-:

Provision of quality education and enhancing learning outcomes of students; bridging social and gender gaps in school education; ensuring equity and inclusion at all levels of school education; ensuring minimum standards in schooling provisions; promoting vocationalisation of education; support States in implementation of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009; and strengthening and up-gradation of SCERTs/State Institutes of Education and DIET as nodal agencies for teacher training.

Goals: -

1. By 2030, ensure that all boys and girls complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes.

2. By 2030, eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of Education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations.

Main Outcomes of the Scheme are envisaged as Universal Access, Equity and Quality, Vocationalisation of Education and strengthening of Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs).

Major interventions across all levels of school education under the scheme:

- (i) Universal Access including Infrastructure Development and Retention;
- (ii) Gender and Equity;
- (iii) Inclusive Education;
- (iv) Quality;
- (v) Financial support for Teacher Salary;
- (vi) Digital Initiatives;
- (vii) RTE Entitlements including uniforms, textbooks etc.;
- (viii) Pre-school Education;
- (ix) Vocational Education;
- (x) Strengthening of Teacher Education and Training;
- (xi) Monitoring;

The main emphasis of the Scheme is on improving quality of school education by focusing on the two T's – Teacher and Technology. The strategy for all interventions under the Scheme would be to enhance the Learning Outcomes at all levels of schooling. The scheme proposes to give flexibility to the States

and UTs to plan and prioritize their interventions within the scheme norms and the overall resource envelope available to them. Funds are proposed to be allocated based on objective criteria based on enrolment of students, committed liabilities, learning outcomes and various performance indicators.

Integration of Teacher Education facilitates effective convergence and linkages between different support structures in school education through interventions such as a unified training calendar, innovations in pedagogy, mentoring and monitoring, etc. Single scheme enables the SCERT to become the nodal agency for conduct and monitoring of all in-service training programmes to make it need-focused and dynamic. It also enables reaping benefits of technology and widening access of good quality education across all States and UTs and across all sections of the society.

I. Directorate of Elementary Education

In order to cater to the educational need of Pre-Primary children, Government of Sikkim took a major decision to introduce the Kindergarten system in all the 763 Government Schools from the academic session 2018 vide notification No. 656/DIR/PE/HRDD Dt. 05/02/2018.

c. Support at Pre- Primary Level (Elementary) 2019-2020:

- 1. Non-Recurring: Outdoor play materials/equipment and other items for the kindergarten children were provided to all Government schools in the State.
- 2. Recurring: As per approval of PAB, first aid box and Teaching Learning Materials were provided for Pre- Primary Sections of all Government Schools. However, training for PPT scheduled during March 2020, could not be conducted due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

II. Activities completed under Samagra Shiksha (Elementary) in 2019-20

a. Free Textbook

Provision of Free Textbook to the students of Elementary Stage is also a RtE entitlement. The following are the details of fund sanctioned under this intervention.

b. Free Uniform

Under the RtE entitlement, the students studying at Elementary Stage are provided with two sets of uniform to all girls, ST boys, SC boys and BPL boys. During 2019-20 Rs. 346.16 Lakhs under this intervention was sanctioned. The following table gives the details of this approval. The unit cost for this purpose is Rs 6000/- per students. Expenditure is 100%.

c. Residential Hostel

Residential Hostel under North District has been functional since 2015 with an intake capacity of 55 children. Due to the continuous blockage of road during the rainy season it has become difficult to supply food items to Hee-Gyathang Senior Secondary School's residential hostel. As such the residential hostel was attached with three other schools along with Hee-Gyathang Senior Secondary School viz. Lum Primary School, Pentong Primary School and Passingdong Secondary School. However, from 2019-20, the State has been given approval to increase the capacity from 55 to 75 students. School-wise and enrolment of hostel is given below:

d. Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya Scheme (KGBV): -

KGBV Scheme was launched in Sikkim by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, in the year 2011-12 with the aim to increase female literacy in those areas where female literacy rate is below the national female literacy rate. Yuksom Block, in West District, had been identified for the implementation of this scheme. KGBV is residential girls' school with class VI as the entry class. Admission is given only to girls who have dropped from school in class V. Preference, however, is given to girls belonging to SC, ST, socially backward class and minority community.

During the appraisal of 2015-16 RMSA plan, KGBV had been permitted to run classes IX and X as proposed by the State. In 2018, 54 students appeared at the board examination of which 37 students passed the exam and the rest got compartment. In 2019, 16 students appeared at the board examination, out of which 15 students cleared the exam.

Under this head besides many other provisions, we have five full time teachers, one full time accountant, one head teacher and other supporting staff.

e. Progress and Achievement under Inclusive Education 2019-20

Background: Inclusive Education ensures that all children, despite their differences, receive the opportunity of being a part of the same classroom as other children of their age and in-process get the opportunity of learning the curriculum to their optimum potential. In other words, inclusive education means that when children with different learning styles and needs study together, the teacher and the school administrators try to address the unique learning needs, interests, and styles of every student through the teaching process. The basic premise is that the school should meet the educational needs of all children irrespective of their disabilities or limitations.

Inter School Band competition was organised at West Point Senior Secondary School, Gangtok, on 15.11.2019. Seven Senior Secondary and Secondary Schools participated in this event which included four teams from Girls category and three teams from boy's category.

West Point Senior Secondary School (Girls' category) and North Sikkim Academy, Mangan, North Sikkim (Boys category) won the competition and participated in the Zonal Level Band Competition in Guwahati, Assam on 08.01. 2020. In the Zonal Level Band Competition, West Point Senior Secondary (Girls' category) and North Sikkim Academy (Boys' category) won the competition in North-East Zone. The winning teams participated in the National Level Band Competition at Delhi on 23.01.2020.

f. Dr BR Ambedkar Scholarship for Scheduled Caste Students, 2019-2020

The Dr BR Ambedkar Scholarship Scheme is specially designed for the benefit of Scheduled Caste students in the State. District toppers of Class V (five) students from SC category are admitted at Delhi Public School, Yamuna Nagar, Haryana for further studies from Class VI (six) till they complete Class XII (twelve). Their fees and hostel charges are provided by the Samagra Shiksha scheme. This scheme

started in the year 2016 with 4 SC students to uplift the meritorious and economically backward SC students of the State for better education. Till date 16 students are studying in different classes in DPS, Haryana. Four meritorious class V passed SC students for the year 2020 were selected but couldn't be sent to DPS, Yamuna Nagar, due to COVID-19 pandemic.

g. Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat

The programme focusses to enhance interaction between people of diverse culture living in different States/UTs in India with the objective of greater mutual understanding amongst them.

Each year, each State/UT is paired with another State/UT for reciprocal interaction between the people. It is envisaged through this exchange, that the knowledge of language, culture, tradition and practices of different States/UTs will lead to an enhanced understanding and bonding between one another, thereby strengthening the unity and integrity of India. This is the third time that Sikkim and National Capital Territory Delhi have been successfully paired with each other. All activities under Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat in the academic year 2019 -2020 were started from 2nd February 2020, after the reopening of School from winter vacation.

In January and February 2020, teachers from different government schools were sent for exposure trips to the paired State i.e., NCT Delhi, and in the month of February, students from various schools were sent to attend Zonal Level Competition at NCT Delhi and UP for Mallakhamba.

Unfortunately, in the month of March, due to the outbreak of COVID-19 in the entire country, all other physical activities were stopped. However, some activities were conducted through Goggle meeting and printing of booklets containing information regarding history, culture and tradition, educational and administration system etc. of both the States was done.

h. Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan (RAA)

Under RAA (Elementary) the State Project Office, Samagra Shiksha had released Rs. 21.84 lakhs to the District Offices for the conduct of Exposure Visit outside the State. The District-wise distribution of amount is as given in the following table: -

However, this programme could not be conducted due to COVID-19 pandemic and consequent closure of schools.

i. Self Defence Training for Girls.

Self Defence Training for girls of Class VI to Class XII in an intervention of the Samagra Shiksha at Elementary and Secondary levels. Training programme in all the Government schools of Sikkim was done in collaboration with the Sports and Youth Affairs Department, Government of Sikkim from the month of November 2019. A total of 120 Master trainers provided by the Sports and Youth Affairs

Department, who were experts in the field of various disciplines of sports, were entrusted to impart the training to the beneficiaries.

The inauguration ceremony of the training programme State-wide was held at Mangan Girls' Secondary School, North Sikkim which was graced by the presence of District Collector, North District as the Chief Guest followed by the Officials of Sports Department, Officials of Education Department, all the trainers, Coaches and the students. The training was conducted in all the JHS, SS and SSS of Sikkim and was successfully concluded as per the schedule.

j. Yoga Programme

Under the intervention of Yoga under Samagra Shiksha, basic training courses for untrained teachers and refresher courses for trained teachers of short duration are organised. International Yoga Day and other competitions on Yoga are also organised. During the year 2019-20, Basic Yoga training for 350 untrained teachers from all the districts and 230 Physical Educational Instructors and Physical Education Teachers of JHS, SS and SSS have been provided. For the existing yoga trainers, short term refresher courses were conducted by clubbing two or three blocks at a time in three different venues in the East District and in three venues in the West District. From the approved fund, this year, yoga mats to all the Junior High Schools of Sikkim have been provided. As the stand-alone primary schools were provided mats during 2018-19, the remaining schools (SS & SSS) shall be covered in the next session.

The State of Sikkim has been continuously taking part in the competitions and activities related to Yoga in the National Level from the year 2016. This time too, Yoga Olympiad at school level, Block level, District Level and State level were conducted. The selection at all the levels conducted as per the time

framed by the NCERT. The State team has participated in the National level Yoga Olympiad held at NCERT, New Delhi.

On 21st June 2019, International Yoga day was celebrated in a grand manner at the State Level, District Level, Block Level and at schools by involving all the stakeholders. The State Level event held at Paljor Stadium which was graced by the Hon'ble Governor of Sikkim as the Chief Guest along with the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Council of Ministers and other dignitaries.

III. Activities under Samagra Shiksha (Secondary) in 2019-20

- c. School Annual Grants have been provided to Secondary & Senior Secondary Schools.
- d. Self defence for girls training conducted at all the Govt. JHS, SS and SSS during the year 2019-20 in collaboration with the Sports and Youth Affairs Department.
- e. Yoga Training Programme organized for 1250 untrained Teachers during 2019-20. Yoga Materials supplied to all the Pry. Schools and Junior High Schools. Children are regularly taking part in the National level Yoga Olympiad.
- f. In 2018 our children bagged two gold medals in the National Level Yoga Olympiad.

- g. Sports kits provided to all Secondary & Senior Secondary Schools.
- h. Escort Allowances for CWSNs distributed to identify beneficiaries through DBT.
- i. Remedial Teaching under Learning Enhancement programme provided to the identified students of Class IV, VI and IX as per their competency level.
- j. Library books provided to all Secondary & Senior Secondary Schools.
- k. Under Tinkering Lab provision, 20 Sr. Sec. Schools have been provided furniture and hi-end science equipment.
- I. Kala Utsav, a talent showcase competition programme in the field of Visual Art, Music and Dance, was conducted in the districts, State and winners at the State level participated at the National level.
- m. Continuation of services of Graduate Teachers for Maths, Science and Arts subjects.
- n. Upgradation and strengthening work at various schools have been carried out during the year and are at various stages of completion.
- o. Best performing IT teacher has been awarded with laptop under ICT Award Component
- p. Information Kiosks have been setup in various schools
- q. Fund for youth and eco club directly transferred to Sec. and Sr. Sec. Schools @ 25000/- per School. Fund for youth and eco club was also provided to Primary and Jr High Schools @ Rs 5000 and Rs 10000 respectively.
- r. Conducted Professional Development of English Teachers/Skill Development for Communicative English and Soft Skill.
- s. Distribution of Teaching Learning Materials to schools to support pre-primary level.
- t. The annual provision of BRCs & CRCs grants to 31 BACs and 108 CRCs released.
- u. Implementation of various courses under Vocational Scheme at 194 Sec. & Sr. Sec. Schools.
- Under Information and Communication Technology (ICT) scheme, various Sec. & Sr. Sec. Schools and Junior High Schools are being covered.

Vocational Education:

Vocationalization of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education is functional in 194 Government Secondary/Senior Secondary Schools. Under these five vocational trades viz. Information Technology, Travel & Tourism and Retail Trades, Food Production and MSFC are being run as per CBSE scheme of studies. Vocational subjects are being offered as additional subjects in class IX and X (Level I & II) and compulsory electives in class XI and XII (Level III & IV).

CHAPTER 2 DISTRIBUTION TEXTBOOK & UNIFORMS

The State Government has introduced some beneficiary schemes for enhancing enrolment of students at the Primary and Elementary Stage so as to fulfill the national commitment of Universalisation of Elementary Education (UEE). To achieve the goal of Compulsory Elementary Education and to provide quality education in the State, the Government has introduced many beneficiary schemes.

In this endeavor, the Textbook Section of Education Department, Government of Sikkim has been implementing various schemes for the welfare of students of Sikkim as per the guidelines of the Government.

Accordingly, beneficiary items are provided free of cost to the students of Government Schools enumerated as under:

1. SCHOOL UNIFORMS:

Annually distributed items- Pant, Shirt, Skirts, Tunic & Bakhu Set.

- I It is an annual scheme, School Uniforms were distributed to the students of all Government Schools from Classes LKG to V & VI to VIII to notified Government Schools located at remote area till 2009 and from 2010 onwards from Classes Pre-Primary (LKG) to VIII of all Government Schools.
- II. Stitching of 20,004 number of school uniform were given to 30 Self Help group of Sikkim through RMDD, Govt. of Sikkim in compliance with the order of HCM.

TEXTBOOKS:

Free textbooks were distributed to the students of Classes LKG to V till 2009and from 2010 onwards LKG to Class VIII of all the Government Schools and 50% concessional rate from Class IX and above.

CHAPTER 3

SCHOLARSHIP AND EXAMINATION

SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship Section of Education Department undertakes the implementation of scholarship schemes of both the State and Central Government.

The schemes implemented by the Scholarship Section, Education Department as per the school calendar 2019 are as under:

(A) STATE GOVERNMENT SPONSORED SCHEMES.

1. Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme (CMMSS).

The State Government of Sikkim has launched the Hon'ble Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme in the year 2010. This scheme aims to provide *free education* to talented and deserving children from the underprivileged family background with an opportunity to study in reputed private schools both within and outside the State.

With the announcement made by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim during the Tendong Lho Rum Faat celebration at Geyzing on 8th August, 2019, (05) seats exclusively meant for Lepcha students from Dzongu Area has been added in the CMMSS from the academic session 2020. The five students of Dzongu Area will be admitted in Tashi Namgyal Academy. This has enhanced the yearl intake of CMMSS's students from 50 (fifty) to 55 (fifty five).

Screening test of Class V topper students to avail CMMSS for the academic session 2020-21 was conducted on 4th January, 2020 at Sir Tashi Namgyal Senior Secondary School, Gangtok and 55 students (22 boys and 33 girls) were selected through the existing reservation policy and admitted to various schools, forty (45) within Sikkim and ten (10) outside Sikkim.

During the financial year 2019-20, an amount of Rs. 7.00 crore had been approved and sanctioned for the reimbursement of school fees and other expenditure. A pending liability of Rs. 12.69 Crores is due for the FY 2020-21.

The scholarship for the students under extension of CMMS Scheme up to graduation level is being given in the form of reimbursement. In the financial year 2019, an amount of Rs. 1.90 Crores has been sanctioned. The payment for the year 2017, 2018 and 2019(Fresh & Renewal) is in progress.

2. Merit and Prerna Scholarship Schemes for School Education.

(a) Open Competitive Examination for Class V to award Merit and Prerna Scholarship was held on 26th February 2020 in 9 Sub-divisions of the State. For Merit scholarship scheme, three students are selected from the toppers of merit list. For the Prerna Scholarship scheme the next three girl students are selected from the same merit list prepared for each sub-division for the award of both the scholarship. A total of 54 meritorious students were selected for aforesaid scholarships at the Elementary Level.

(i) For Merit Scholarship, 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions were awarded @ Rs. 1200/-, Rs. 1000/- and Rs.

800/- per annum respectively in Classes VI, VII and VIII.

- (ii) For Prerna Scholarship, 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions were awarded @ Rs. 800/-, Rs. 700/- and Rs. 600/- per annum respectively in Classes VI, VII and VIII.
- (b) At the Secondary Level, Merit Scholarship was awarded to students who secured 1st, 2nd and 3rd position at the District Level in Class VIII Annual Examination. Based on merit list, the next three girl students were selected for Prerna Scholarship at the District Level. A total of 24 meritorious students were selected for aforesaid scholarships at the Secondary Level.
- (i) For Merit Scholarship, 1st, 2nd and 3rd position were awarded @ Rs. 1500/-, Rs. 1200/- and Rs. 900/- per annum respectively in Classes IX and X.
- (ii) For Prerna Scholarship, 1st, 2nd and 3rd position were awarded @ Rs. 900/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 700/- per annum respectively in Classes IX and X.

Under Merit and Prerna scholarships scheme, an amount of Rs. 1.858 lakhs for 206 students (Fresh and Renewal) of 2017 academic year was awarded in the year 2019.

3. Post Matric Scholarship.

The Post Matric Scholarship is granted to all local students under merit and general categories pursuing various courses within and outside the state.

(a) MERIT SCHOLARSHIP:-

Scholarship ranging from Rs.800/- to Rs. 2,000/- p.m. is awarded to students who secure 80% and above in Class XII Board Examination or equivalent. The percentage is calculated from the scores of English and three main subjects. Further, annual reimbursement of maximum Rs.10,000/- is also awarded for some courses viz. MBBS/BDS, B. Tech/ B. Arch and some notified honors at graduation level.

(b) GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP:-

All local students securing less than 80% but more than 60% are granted scholarship in selected courses as notified by the Department on submission of valid income certificate of Rs.10,000/- per month or less for both parents. Further, annual reimbursement of maximum Rs.10,000/- is also awarded for some courses viz. MBBS/BDS, B. Tech/ B. Arch and some notified honors at graduation level.

(c) FELLOWSHIP FOR M.PHIL & PHD SCHOLARS:-

Scholarship is awarded for pursuing Ph. D courses @ Rs.6,000/- p.m. for regular candidates with subject related to the State of Sikkim with a contingency grant of Rs.15,000/- per annum for a maximum period of three years and Rs. 3,000/- p.m. for in- service candidates with reimbursement of Rs. 12,000/- per annum.

The pending payment of post matric scholarship schemes since 2014 is in progress from the fund of Rs. 6.65 crores released in the year 2018-19. The total beneficiaries under Post Matric scholarship for the year 2019 is 33 (17 male & 16 female). The disbursement of post matric scholarship payment is made through Direct Bank Transfer (DBT) to the beneficiaries bank account seeded with Aadhaar.

4. Grant of Financial Assistance to Local Students admitted to Rashtriya Indian Military College (RIMC), Dehradun.

The scholarship section also grants the financial assistance to the local students studying in Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun at the rate of Rs. 20,000 /- per annum per student. The candidates have to qualify in the entrance exam conducted by the Home Department for the said Institute. The said exam is conducted twice in a year in the month of June and December.

At present, one student is studying in RIMC, Dehradun, the detail of which is given in the following table. The payment of scholarship for the cadet @ Rs. 20,000 has been released for the academic session 2019-20.

8. Grant of Financial Assistance to Local BPL Students admitted to Government Colleges in the State.

Financial assistance at the rate of Rs. 300/- p.m. is awarded to local students under BPL category studying in Government Colleges in the State. However, for the past many years there has been no applicant under the said scheme.

Reimbursement of tuition fees to students in Destitute Homes of Sikkim.

The local students living in various Destitute Homes of Sikkim (Atish Dipankar Destitute Home, Chakung and Kaluk Destitute Home) can claim for reimbursement of the school tuition fees from the Scholarship Section, HRDD, Government of Sikkim. However, for the past many years there has been no applicant under the said scheme.

(B) CENTRAL GOVERNMENT SPONSORED SCHEMES.

10. National Talent Search Examination (NTSE).

The purpose of the scheme is to identify talented students and nurture them. NTSE is meant for students studying in class X. There will be two-stage selection processes for award of scholarship, Stage I at the state level and stage II at the national level. The students who qualify stage I will be eligible to appear in stage II examination conducted by NCERT. The stage I examination was conducted at the district head quarters on 3rd Nov, 2019. On the basis of stage I examination, 50 students were selected for stage II this year. The qualified students receive the scholarship from class XI up to PhD studies.

11. National Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS).

The centrally sponsored, National Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS) was launched in May 2008. The objective of the scheme is to award scholarship to meritorious students of economically weaker sections to arrest their drop out at class VIII and encourage them to continue the study at secondary stage. Scholarship of Rs. 12000/per annum (Rs. 1000/-per month) per student is awarded to selected students every year to study in classes from IX to XII in State Government.

Government aided and local body schools. The student whose parental income from all sources is not more than Rs. 1,50,000/- per annum are eligible to avail the scholarship. There is reservation as per State Government norms. The students are selected for this scholarship through an examination conducted by Education Department, Government of Sikkim. Scholarships are disbursed by the State Bank of India, New Delhi directly into the Bank accounts (DBT) of students in quarterly basis. The selection test was conducted for the year 2019-20 in the four districts on 3rd November, 2019.During the year 2019-20, 58(fifty eight) students were benefitted by the scheme.

12. National Scheme of Incentive to Girls for Secondary Education (NSIGSE).

The Scheme of Incentive to Girls for Secondary Education (NSIGSE) has been stopped in the year 2018 and it is under the process of redesigning by the MHRD.

13. North East Council (NEC).

Education Department has been extending financial support to the students pursuing higher education in professional courses under "Stipend and Book Grant" from NEC Shillong. The North East Council has been rendering financial assistant in the form of stipend and book grant to the students of North East States through the State Government including Sikkim since 2006. The assistance is given for Diploma, Degree, Post Graduation, M. Phil and Ph. D. courses. This scheme is now going to be integrated with the National Scholarship Portal(NSP). At present, the work of integration is in the process.




272 Students appeared from all the four Districts. This year 5 seats are added for the students of Dzongu area.

CLASS V MERIT /PRERNA SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION

A total of 54 students are selected every year for the award of general merit and Prerna Scholarship. Six students, three on merit and three from amongst the girls for Prerna scholarship are nominated from each sub-division for the award of scholarships. The merit scholarship examination was held in 9 sub-divisions of the state for awarding merit scholarship at the elementary stage and as usual 54 meritorious students were selected for aforesaid scholarship. In 2020, 550 children appeared in the selection Test.



CBSE Examination

During March –April 2020, the C.B.S.E. class X and XII Examinations were held in 37 Examination Centers all over Sikkim which is supervised by Examination Section every year throughout the State. In addition, Compartmental Examination was also supervised by Exam Cell.

Due to COVID -19 Lockdown, CBSE postponed Exams for some Class XII subjects. Later on the Exams were cancelled.



CHAPTER 4 MID DAY MEAL PROGRAMME

National Programme for Nutritional support to Primary Education Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15th August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalisation of Primary Education by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting on nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary level (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was started in the State of Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (Rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry rations to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001-People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked Mid-Day-Meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

Cooked Mid-Day-Meal served to school children of Sikkim up-to Primary level (class I-V) from 2002 and from class (VI-VIII) are being provided from the academic session 2008, Though GOI norms don't cover the children of Pre-Primary classes for hot cooked meal but Sikkim had unique system of such pre-primary classes in all the Schools, these children were given hot cooked meal till the end of academic session of 2009 without any discrimination by the SMC of the respective schools.

Sikkim state has not come across with any major interruption except a few cases of slightly delay in reaching the food grains during monsoon sessions because of blockade of roads, however, with a view mitigate such problems the Heads of Schools are advised to keep buffer stock of food grains during such period.

OBJECTIVES:-

- The main aims and goal of the MDM Scheme in schools is to stop drop out from schools.
- Provide hot cooked meal in the schools so that the students can pay attention to their education.
- Develop healthy body by providing nutritious food.
- ✤ MDM shall stop gender disparities, social barriers.

TRANSFER OF FUNDS

From the academic year 2014 the funds under Mid-Day Meal Scheme has been totally transferred to MDM accounts of respective schools after obtaining en-bloc sanction of the Government of Sikkim. Thereafter, during 2015-16 the HRDD has obtained the approval of the Green Channel Wherein, funds under MDM Scheme can be transferred in account of schools head within no time.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME OF MDM SCHEME AT DISTRICT LEVEL

Awareness Programme of MDM at all the four district had been conducted by the MDM Cell, HRDD attended by Special Secretary, HRDD, Addl. Director [MDM] and officials from the department to sensitize the heads of the schools pertaining to entitlement under MDM, accountability, transparency, participation of stake holders and smooth functioning.

HANDBOOK OF MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

Handbook of Mid-Day Meal Scheme introduced by the State Project Office, MDM, Cell, HRDD containing all the Circulars, Guidelines, Formats and details of schools, complexes, BACs, etc has been distributed to all the schools, stake holders.

- 6. Many schools are maintaining kitchen garden and poly house to provide organic/fresh mid day meal from the school kitchen garden.


CHAPTER – 5 TEACHER EDUCATION IN SIKKIM



2. IN-SERVICE TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAMME

The In-service teacher Training programme is one of the major roles envisaged for DIETs. The year 2019-2020 has been a eventful as far as In-service training programme was concerned. Around 8000 Elementary teachers have been trained under National Initiative in the State. The faculty members of DIETs have been part of State Key Resource Persons group for National Initiatives for School Heads & Teachers' Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA)who conducted Teachers training in five phases in the State covering around 8000 elementary teachers.

The year also saw the training of Elementary Teachers on e-learning where around 400 teachers covering 200 schools across the State were trained to use Meghshala Apps. Meghshala apps support teachers in their lesson planning. The training was conducted by Meghshala Trust, Bengaluru in collaboration with DIETs following the signing of Tripatite MoU between Education Department, Meghshala Trust, Bengaluru and CISCO CSR on August 14, 2019. The 400 teachers identified for training were distributed district –wise – East – 150, North- 50, West -100 and South – 100

CHAPTER 8 HIGHER EDUCATION

The Directorate of Higher Education is one of the pivotal Sections of the Education Department catering to equip the higher educational institutions with all necessary resources and promote the quality of higher education in the State by investing on infrastructure, faculty and technology.

The State of Sikkim presently has twelve (12) established Government colleges which are directly under the supervision of the DHE. The administration matters of these colleges are as such dealt by the DHE while also coordinating with the affiliating Universities.

With the exception of two Institutions'; Sikkim Institute of Higher Nyingma Studies (SHEDA) and Sanskrit Mahavidhyala, Samdong which are affiliated to Sampoornanda University at Benaras, all the other Government colleges are affiliated to Sikkim University.

Further the State has one (1) Central University, one (1) State University and four (04) Private Universities. These Universities and Private colleges though functioning as autonomous Institutions of higher education are also closely monitored by the DHE and have the Director/Higher Education or the Addl. Chief Secretary, Education Department as a member in their Governing/Executive body.

The implementation of the central sponsored scheme "Rashtriya Uchchtar Shiksha Abhiyan" (RUSA) is also done by the DHE.

The following have been the achievements of the Directorate of Higher Education in the F.Y 2019-2020 to till date:

- 1. <u>Appointment of regular teaching faculty for Science subjects and for B.Ed College, Soreng:</u> With approval of the State Government the DHE was able to appoint twenty-two (22) regular teaching faculties in various Science subjects. Further seven (07) regular teaching faculties were also appointed by the DHE for B.Ed College, Soreng.
- 2. <u>UPSC Coaching:</u> The DHE in association with ALS Education Pvt. Ltd. is providing free coaching for UPSC examinations to fifty (50) IAS aspirants of Sikkim. Classes for the same are being held at NBBBD College, Tadong.
- 3. <u>Appointment of Asst. Professors on adhoc basis</u>: Owing to the increase in student enrolment which threby lead to a rise in the requisition of teaching faculty by the colleges, 35 fresh candidates in different subjects were appointed by the Directorate on adhoc basis.

CHAPTER 9 RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA)

In order to improve the gross enrolment ratio of higher education and make higher education relevant to global needs, MHRD launched Rashtriya Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) in the year 2013. The main objectives of RUSA are as under:

- Improve access, equity and quality in higher education through planned development
- Usher transformative reforms
- Ensure academic and examination reforms
- Ensure adequate availability of quality faculty
- Improve equity for women, minorities and differently abled
- Bring about affiliation and governance reforms
- Link guiding with reforms
- Mandatory accreditation
- Focus on research and innovation

The State of Sikkim joined RUSA in 2014 and thereafter the following steps have been taken in the FY 2019-20.

New Professional College

Fresh batch of students enrolled for B. Tech in civil and computer science engineering at the **Sikkim Institute of Science and Technology, Chisopani** using the administrative block while the academic block is under construction.

In the FY 2019-20 under RUSA 1.0, the State of Sikkim has received installments under components Infrastructure Grants to Colleges and Equity Initiatives which has been transferred to the respective beneficiary colleges. Workshops and remedial classes were conducted for the knowledge and awareness of the students.

Additionally, funds have been received under RUSA 2.0 for the component Infrastructure Grants to Colleges approved for five State Govt. Colleges in 16th PAB on 9th September 2019.

Under RUSA component Vocationalization of Higher Education, a computer literacy course is being conducted under Center for Research and Training in Informatics (CRTI) wing from the Department of Information Technology. The said course is approved by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and is recognized pan India.

CHAPTER 10 TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Directorate of Technical Education has been functioning in the Education Department ever since 1998 and there has been considerable activity in this area. The importance of modern technology and the advent of the computer age have resulted in the urgent need to equip our students with adequate knowledge and exposure in these areas. The industrial growth in the State will to a large extent depend on the existence of a base of skilled technicians. The State Govt has taken the initiative to meet these challenges and this is reflected in high priority it has accorded to and its policy statements on Industry and Information Technology and Education.

The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) is primarily charged with the responsibility for overseeing the functioning of the two Polytechnics namely Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC), Bardang, East Sikkim and Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT), Chisopani, South Sikkim established under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project for catering Diploma Engineering course in the State.

The Sikkim Institute of Science & Technology (SIST), Chisopani was established in the year 2018 and is currently running with an enrollment of 70 Students under two departments namely Civil Engineering and Computer Engineering.

I. Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC), Bardang, East Sikkim1. UKEIRI programme

AICTE is in collaboration with British Council for the joint operation of the activities under UK India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) Phase-III. UK India Education Research Initiative (UKIERI) started in April 2006 with the aim of enhancing educational links between India and the UK. In academic year 2019-20, the Council targeted to train 200 delegates under the Leadership & Management program from AICTE approved institutes/ Polytechnics. The participants were screened and shortlisted by an expert committee for undergoing the programme. After successful short listing and having fulfilled all the mandatory criteria dictated by AICTE, three of our senior most faculty members of ATTC Bardang were selected for participation in this programme:

- (i) Mr. Lochan Kumar Adhikari, Vice Principal cum Head of Department (DM & DMT)
- (ii) Mr. Bhasker Sharma, Head of Department (DME)
- (iii) Ms. Rinchen G. Dorjee, Training and Placement Officer cum Course Incharge (DM)

This program was conducted in different locations in India by experts from Dudley College, UK and was aimed at providing an overview of the key leadership and management challenges facing educational practitioners today, with a focus on the application of effective leadership and management techniques and their beneficial impact on departmental and institutional performance.

Further, one of the shortlisted faculty, Mr. Lochan Kumar Adhikari, Vice Principal cum Head of Department (DM & DMT), was further selected by the joint selection committee of Experts from AICTE, British Council and Dudley College for five days Study Tour to Dudley College, UK during the month of October 2019. He successfully completed the tour and proved the programme to be a beneficial one for the institute as well.

2. Institution of Engineers (India)

The Institution of Engineers (India) [IEI] is a statutory body to promote and advance the engineering and technology, established in 1920 and incorporated by Royal Charter in 1935. It is the largest multidisciplinary professional body of engineers encompassing 15 (fifteen) engineering disciplines with a Corporate membership of over 2 lakhs, and serving the nation for more than 9 decades. The IEI is a pioneer body to introduce, starting from 1928, continuing engineering education programme, successful completion of which is recognized as equivalent to a degree in engineering by the Government of India, the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), the State Governments and many Public/Private Sector organizations in the country.

Mr. Lochan Kumar Adhikari, Vice Principal cum Head of Department (DM & DMT) was nominated as the Hon. Secretary of the Third Committee, Sikkim State Centre, IEI (SSC-IEI) and the office for the same was subsequently shifted to ATTC, Bardang from CAEPHT, Ranipool. Under this programme, all faculty members of our institute have successfully enrolled for the membership of IEI.

3. NBA related visit

Rajiv Gandhi Government Polytechnic, Itanagar nominated two of their senior faculty to visit our institution during the month of August 2019 to take first hand information regarding NBA accreditation. This came into spotlight as ATTC, Bardang was one of the first north-eastern polytechnic to get NBA accredited in 2018. Our institute provided all the requisites to the visiting members and aided them regarding NBA accreditation.

4. Campus Placement

Our institute has registered a whopping 90% campus placement during the academic year 2019-20 to various private and government organizations in and outside the state.

5. NSS volunteers

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. It provides opportunity to the student youth of 10+2 Board level and student youth of Technical Institution, Graduate & Post Graduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government led community service activities & programmes. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service.

Our institute has been one of the active members in NSS of our state and we currently have two cells viz. Cell 1 and Cell 2 with an enrollment of 200 student volunteers from different branches and semesters.

Some of the activities carried out are listed below:

- 1. School Beautification
- 2. NSS Awareness Rally
- 3. Village Camps
- 4. Health Camps
- 5. Blood Donation Camps
- 6. Swachata Abhiyans
- 7. Youth Parliaments (Participation)

During the month of February 2020, two of our NSS volunteers, namely Mr. Ezra Dulal Biswakarma and Ms. Nirmala Dulal were nominated to attend the Inter-Institution Camp on Leadership & Personality Development programme organized by NSS Cell, Dept. of Sports & Youth Affairs, Government of Sikkim at Palzor Stadium, Gangtok. A total of 20 out of 200 students were selected as the Best Volunteers out of which our above two students were also selected. They were further selected to represent our state in North East Youth Festival which was supposed to be held on the month of March 2020. However, due to the current pandemic situation, the aforementioned programme has now been suspended.

II. Centre for Computers and Communication Technology, Chisopani, South Sikkim

Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT), Chisopani, South Sikkim, a Government owned autonomous polytechnic established by the Government of Sikkim under the World Bank funded Third Technical Education (TechEd-III) project of MHRD. It is the premier polytechnic in the state of Sikkim providing Technical Education since 1999. Its establishment objective was to addressing the need to imbibe skill and employment oriented qualities for the unemployed youth in trades that are highly demanded in government, public and private sectors. It was setup as a 'Center of excellence' to provide quality education and training for students within the state, the nation and even neighboring countries. The institute offers Diploma Engineering courses in Computer Science and Technology, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Civil Engineering

The institute added one more new branch i.e., Diploma in Mechanical Engineering from the academic session 2019-20 with an intake of 60 seats.

Two faculty members for Diploma in Computer Science were recruited in December 2019.

III. Sikkim Institute of Science & Technology (SIST), Chisopani, South Sikkim

- i. The Admission of Students in SIST is improving gradually year on year.
- ii. The performance of Students in University is good.
- iii. The Students of SIST have participated in various extra-curricular activities in universities and other colleges and performed well.
- iv. SIST organised Mother Tongue day, Swachha Bharat Abhiyan, Ek Bharat Shresta Bharat mission and Cleanliness drive in Campus.
- v. SIST is imparting free quality technical education to all the COI holder Students and the students of other state at a very nominal fee.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACHIEVEMENT;

- i. SIST has appointed a well experience person in Academic and Administration as Principal-cum-Director along with Administrative Officer, Faculty members, Technical support staff and Other Administrative Staff.
- ii. The Administrative Building of SIST is completed and fully functional. The building houses Director's Office, Administrative and Finance Offices, Library, Classroom, Labs, Faculty Chambers, Examination Cell, & Conference Hall.

- iii. Construction of Academic Building has started.
- iv. SIST Administration is working in tandem with CCCT Administration and Faculty members for conduction of Theory and Lab classes and successfully conducted all theory and lab classes smoothly.
- v. SIST is signed five MOUs with five companies to impart internship and conduction of workshops and seminar.

CHAPTER 11 DIRECTORATE OF LANGUAGES

The following activities were taken up by the Directorate of Languages to facilitate the students, teachers and schools as a whole:

- Syllabi for Summative and Formative Assessments for CCE was also prepared for Classes I to VIII.
- The Directorate has been preparing question papers for Bhutia, Lepcha, Nepali, Limboo, Tamang, Sherpa, Rai, Gurung and Tibetan languages for the internal as well as CBSE Board Exams of above classes IX to XII every year. It is a regular feature.
- This Directorate also prepared the curricula and syllabi for D.EI.Ed. in the new pattern as designed by the NCTE.
- > This Directorate also prepared question papers for STET Exams.
- The Directorate is preparing the manuscripts of respective language books required for the forthcoming academic session 2020-21 and also deals with the curricula, syllabi and sample question papers for the D.EI.Ed. programme.
- Moreover, in total 572 posts of language teachers of all categories viz., Primary, Graduate and Post Graduate have been created for all the Regional Languages including G.T Nepali for 101 Posts. Now, the results are awaited.
- Furthermore, initiatives are being taken accordingly to provide regular language teachers for all the Government Schools of Sikkim in the forthcoming academic session 2020.
- Now, the Directorate has put up a proposal to the authorities to set-up a language laboratory, starting an e-Pathsala, DIKSHA, Digitalization of manuscripts, well-equipped library and a Resource Centre for conducting workshops periodically for fruitful teaching-learning outcomes in future.
- The Directorate of languages has prepared a programme to facilitate the students of all state official languages in pursuing their studies at Secondary and Senior Secondary level. The Directorate, with the approval of the Govt. has constituted a State Board for Indigenous and Endangered languages of Sikkim viz., Tamang, Sherpa, Rai, Gurung, Mukhia, Manger and Newar for Protection and Conservation of these languages from extinction.
- The Directorate has also started to re-module language Text Books in the form of Term Books with an objective of minimizing the School bag from the Academic Session 2021 onwards.
- Post creation for 07 languages viz., Tamang, Sherpa, Rai, Gurung, Mukhia, Manger and Newar for 53 GTs and 91 PRTs totaling 144 posts are already proposed since 2018. These languages are taught up-to secondary level presently.
- Distance mode is started for indigenous and endangered languages Viz., Rai, Gurung, Tamang, Sherpa & Manger under Education Department, Govt. of Sikkim vide Notification No-417/plg/HRDD dated: 18/12/2018.
