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### **FOREWORD**

The Government of Sikkim has accorded highest priority to the education sector by providing an outlay of almost 20% of the State's budget and records have shown that much progress has been achieved, manifesting in remarkable performances by our students who have qualified for many competitive examinations, acquired doctoral and post doctoral degrees and are successfully employed in other parts of the country and abroad.

Jointly managed at the national and state levels, many initiatives have been undertaken to improve access to quality schooling-particularly for those who are economically and socially disadvantaged. With thriving competition from private schools there have been clear efforts within the government sector to offer parents and children what they most need and want: quality education leading to improved life opportunities.

Education per se has numerous indicators wherein 'values' is of prime importance. Apart from academic excellence, our children have been taught to respect women and elders, maintain peace and harmony, show concern for the environment, maintain cleanliness, be of help to the society, organize yoga and self defence (for girls) program at various schools along with the training of School Managing Committees and programs of community mobilization.

Governmental interventions have been successful in acquiring accreditation for six Sikkim Government Colleges by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) which has been a major achievement for the Directorate of Higher Education.

The project Samagra Shiksha has brought back most of the out of school children back into the school system while incentives like the mid day meal scheme free uniforms, text books, rain-coat, shoes and socks distribution have helped retain students in the school system. This scheme has added infrastructural support to accommodate a larger number of students in schools. It also has components relating to education of differently-abled children.

Taking all the above approaches in pursuance to the education policy, various steps have also been taken by the government in the year 2020-21 to especially facilitate the teaching learning process. The Education Department on its part has taken up the policies of the government for implementation in the year 2020-21. As such this report is a compilation of activities pertaining to various sections of the department.

# PRIMARY EDUCATION

The Directorate of Primary Education was established vide Notification No. 168/HRDD/(HQ) Dated 20/09/2013 to address the concerns of the primary section and to give strong thrust in laying a sound foundation for young children. Later, Directorate of Primary Education was renamed as Directorate of Elementary Education. In order to cater to the need of pre primary children, Government of Sikkim introduced LKG and UKG in all Government Schools w.e.f.2016 and now as per the NEP 2020 Nursery classes are also introduced in Government schools from the session 2021 as per notification No. 449/EDN/PLG Dt. 05/04/2021 for the children of 3 years of age in order to implement three years of pre schooling (3-6 yrs). As the first 6 years of a child's life is known as formative years which are recognized as remarkable time for brain growth and development, specific attention to their needs is our priority. Further training/ orientation of Pre Primary Teachers on NEP 2020 is in process. Teaching Learning Materials were distributed focusing on foundational literacy and numeracy of Pre-primary children under the provision of Samagra Shiksha.

# **HOME SCHOOLING:**

Due to subsequent closure of school during Covid-19 pandemic many online mode of education like Edutech apps, Television, Radio, WhatsApp are used to deliver the lesson. The concept of home schooling was introduced vide ref. no.66/SPO/SS/Edn/2020-21, dated 14/07/2020 especially for the children of Pre-Primary and Primary level. The concept of home-schooling is "If the child cannot go to school, let the school go to the child". Many teachers and volunteers are teaching students of their nearby area at suitable location and homes, for catering the educational needs of students from Kindergarten to class VIII, since the basic elementary education is Fundamental Right of children. Even Preloaded laptops with study materials of different classes have been sent to Block Levels and remote areas though CRCC and BRCC for proper transaction of lesson especially for elementary children during the lockdown period.

# DR.B.R.AMBEDKAR SCHOLARSHIP FOR SC STUDENTS:

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Scholarship Scheme is specially designed for the benefit of SC students in the state. The district topper of class V (five) students from SC category are nominated every year under Dr. B. R. Ambedkar scholarship i.e. one students from each district and sent to DPS, Yamuna Nagar, Haryana for further studies.

This scheme started in the year 2016 with 4 SC students for free education. The purpose of the scheme is to uplift the meritorious and economically backward SC students of the state for better education. The selected students are admitted in class VI (six) till they complete class XII (Twelve) with all the facilities from the scheme. Till date 16 students are studying in different classes in DPS, Haryana. Four meritorious class V passed SC students for the year 2020 was selected but couldn't send to DPS, Yamuna Nagar, due to Covid -19 pandemic. Even the selection process for 2021 also completed and we have plans to send them along with the selected students of 2020 when the situation becomes normal. Further the expenses of these Dr B.R. Ambedkar Scholarship Scheme are borne by Samagra Shiksha till date.

# SAMAGRA SHIKSHA

Samagra Shiksha is an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class 12 and has been, therefore, prepared with the broader goal of improving school effectiveness measured in terms of equal opportunities for schooling and equitable learning outcomes. It subsumes the three erstwhile Schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE).

# Major Objectives and Goal of the Scheme:

Provision of quality education and enhancing learning outcomes of students; bridging social and gender gaps in school education; ensuring equity and inclusion at all levels of school education; ensuring minimum standards in schooling provisions; promoting vocationalisation of education; support States in implementation of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009; and strengthening and up-gradation of SCERTs/State Institutes of Education and DIET as nodal agencies for teacher training.

#### Goals:

- 1. By 2030, ensure that all boys and girls complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes.
- 2. By 2030, eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of Education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations.

Main Outcomes of the Scheme are envisaged as Universal Access, Equity and Quality, Vocationalisation of Education and strengthening of Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs).

# Major interventions across all levels of school education under the scheme:

- (i) Universal Access including Infrastructure Development and Retention;
- (ii) Gender and Equity;
- (iii) Inclusive Education;
- (iv) Quality;
- (v) Financial support for Teacher Salary;
- (vi) Digital Initiatives;
- (vii) RTE Entitlements including uniforms, textbooks etc.;
- (viii) Pre-school Education;
- (ix) Vocational Education;
- (x) Strengthening of Teacher Education and Training;
- (xi) Monitoring;

The main emphasis of the Scheme is on improving quality of school education by focusing on the two Ts – Teacher and Technology. The strategy for all interventions under the Scheme would be to enhance the

Learning Outcomes at all levels of schooling. The scheme proposes to give flexibility to the States and UTs to plan and prioritize their interventions within the scheme norms and the overall resource envelope available to them. Funds are proposed to be allocated based on objective criteria based on enrolment of students, committed liabilities, learning outcomes and various performance indicators.

Integration of Teacher Education facilitates effective convergence and linkages between different support structures in school education through interventions such as a unified training calendar, innovations in pedagogy, mentoring and monitoring, etc. Single scheme enables the SCERT to become the nodal agency for conduct and monitoring of all in-service training programmes to make it need-focused and dynamic. It also enables reaping benefits of technology and widening access of good quality education across all States and UTs and across all sections of the society.

#### I. Directorate of Elementary Education

In order to cater to the educational need of Pre-Primary children, Government of Sikkim took a major decision to introduce the kindergarten system in all the 763 Government Schools from the academic session 2018 vide notification No. 656/DIR/PE/HRDD Dt. 05/02/2018.

# a. Key Features and Implementation Process of KG System

- Because of KG System parents took more interest in sending wards to government schools
- Classroom teaching has been improved with the trained teachers
- Supply of materials and TLM in the schools
- Separate uniforms for KG Students
- Enrolment of 3+ and 4-year-old children in LKG
- Enrolment of 4+ and 5-year-old children in UKG
- ECCE Key Resource Persons (KRPs)developed by NCERT
- Handholding of Pre-Primary Teachers (PPTs) and PRTs by KRPs in nearby schools

#### **b.** SUPPORT AT PRE- PRIMARY LEVEL (ELEMENTARY) 2020-2021:

1. RECURRING: Recurring support utilized for the care corner and TLM for Pre- Primary in all Government Schools. However, the Training for PPT scheduled during March 2020, could not be conducted due to Covid-19 Pandemic.

#### II. Activities Completed under Samagra Shiksha (Elementary) in 2020-21

#### a) Free Textbook

Samagra Shiksha provides financial assistance to Education Department for the procurement of textbooks at the rate of Rs. 250/- per student at Primary Level and Rs. 400/- per student at Upper Primary Level. For the financial year 2020-21, Samagra Shiksha was sanctioned Rs. 188.315 lakh for providing free textbook to the 57694 students studying at the Elementary Level, including 21 numbers of Braille Books. The expenditure under this head of accounts is 100%.

# b) Free Uniform

Procurement of uniform for distribution to all the girls and boy students (ST, SC and BPL categories) of Elementary stage is also an annual feature of Samagra Shiksha. For this purpose, an amount of Rs. 301.73 lakh was sanctioned for the financial year 2020 -21 for providing free uniform to 50289 children at the unit cost of Rs. 700/- and expenditure in this respect also 100%.

### c) Residential Hostel

Residential Hostel under North District has been functional since 2015 with an intake capacity of 55 children. Due to the continuous blockage of road during the rainy season it has become difficult to supply food items to Hee-Gyathang Senior Secondary School's residential hostel, as such the residential hostel was attached with three other schools along with Hee-Gyathang Senior Secondary School viz. Lum Primary School, Pentong Primary School and Passingdong Secondary School. However, from 2020-21, the State has been approved to increase the capacity to 100 Students and sanctioned Rs. 30.65 Lakh to run the Hostel and an additional Rs lakh for bedding.

### d) Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya Scheme (KGBV): -

KGBV Scheme was launched in Sikkim by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, in the year 2011-12 with the aim to increase female literacy in those areas where female literacy rate is below the national female literacy rate. Yuksam Block, in West District, had been identified for the implementation of this scheme. KGBV is residential girls' school with class VI as the entry class. Admission is given only to girls who dropped from school in class V, preference, however, are given to girls belonging to SC, ST, Socially Backward Class and Minority Community.

During the appraisal of 2015-16 RMSA plan, KGBV had been upgraded to run classes IX and X as proposed by the State. In 2018, 54 students appeared at the board examination of which 37 students passed the exam and the rest got compartment. In 2019, 16 students appeared at the board examination, out of which 15 students cleared the exam. In 2020, 46 students appeared the exam and all of them passed.

During 2020 Academic Session Rs 4.6 Lakhs for replacement of 230 beddings in the hostel at the unit cost of Rs 2000/- per girls. Under Recurring head, we have been sanctioned Rs 76.32 Lakh for running KGBV. Under this head besides many other provisions, we have five full time teachers, one full accountant, one head teacher and other supporting staff.

# Progress and Achievement under Inclusive Education 2021-22

### e) INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

To provide an accessible environment in school (both physical and academic) Inclusive Education cell, Samagra Shiksha is working continuously.

For the accessibility of CwSN following routine activities are being implemented.

- Identification and Assessment camp
- Construction of Ramp and DFT Toilets (shifting of the classroom at ground floor is also in practice)
- Purchase and Distribution of Assistive Devices
- Sports and Exposure visits within and outside State
- One Day Orientation Program for the awareness of Teachers, HOI, parents etc
- Special Educators training program
- Construction of Resource Rooms and purchase of equipment
- Escort allowance and Stipend for child etc.,

# **Progress and Achievements 2020-21**

- To develop Braille study material for visually impaired children the two sets of Computer along with language translator software, talking calculator, magnifying A4 sheets, DAISY player DUXBURY has been distributed to two blind schools.
- Provision of 5% reservation in higher education has been notified with the approval of the State government.
- Provision of 5% reservation for Chief Minister Merits Scholarship has also been approved by state government and implemented (yet to be notified, under process)
- For Home Based Education's CwSN -Sanitary pad for girls and diaper for boys has been distributed
- For IEP and theoretical services 25 sets of Resource Room equipment and materials have been installed in 25 govt. Secondary/senior secondary Schools.
- Out of 59 SEs/ RTs, eight Special Educators/Resource Teachers are appointed on regular basis Manpower services in Inclusive Education 53 special Educators are in Elementary Level —in position 6 Special Educators are in Secondary Level in position 20 new Special Educators for Secondary Level has been sanctioned during the PAB meeting 2021-22 and the recruitment process is going on Initiative Taken by Inclusive Education during COVID-19 Pandemic.

With the help of special educators, the subject teachers are taking online classes. Though it is a very challenging task to conduct online classes due to many circumstances like network shadow areas, unavailability of smartphones, poor power supply, therefore, homeschooling is also in practice.

For Homeschooling, special educators/resource teachers are visiting the home of CwSN with the permission of parents or concerned authorities.

During this COVID-19 period, CwSNs are also getting opportunities to explore their talent in various activities like essay competitions, painting competitions, virtual dance competitions, virtual singing competitions, virtual Special Olympic competitions and many more.

# **Initiative Taken for Digital learning**

To promote the digital learning and e- content among CwSN, of Mobile apps like e-Pathshala, vedanti and YouTube channel are encouraged where they can get their require study materials

For digital fun activities we encourage the children to use mobile apps like eye game, balloon game which help in sensory development and cognitive development of children

### f) INTER SCHOOL BAND COMPETITION

Inter School Band Competition was started in the year 2017 to inculcate the sprite of patriotism and unity among School Student. The competition was open for all categories of Schools and organised at three levels viz. State, Zonal and National Level. State Level Band Competition is organised by Samagra Shiksha, Education Department.

During, 2017-2018, Sadam Sr. Sec School (boys' category) stood second position at National Level. In the year 2018-2019, Girl's category (Jorethang Sr. Sec. School) stood first position at National Level and in the year 2019-2020, both category, North Sikkim Academy (boys category) and West Point Sr. sec. School (Girls category) successfully participated at National Level.

In 2020-21, as per Project Approval Board (PAB), a sum of rupees 5.0 lakhs was sanctioned to organise the State Level Band competition but due to covid-19 pandemic the programme could not be conducted.

Therefore, two sets of band instruments were procured and handed over to District Education Office, West District (aspirational district) and South District (best performing band competition).

#### g) BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO

Basically, **BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO** was unleashed with the objective of addressing the declining child Sex Ratio (CSR) and other issues related to the women empowerment to help remove gender-based discrimination and elimination, to protect girls' child. **BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO** was launched by the Honourable Prime Minister of India on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2015 at Panipat, Haranaya, "Sukanya Samriddhi Youjana" launched by the Government of India in 2015 as part of **BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO** campaign to encourage saving for the Girls Childs future.

As per Project Approval Board (PAB), 2020-2021, a sum of Rs. 18.3 lakhs were sanctioned to organise various activities at 366 Primary Schools under "Beti Padhao Beti Bachao" component.

Samagra Shiksha organised "BAC Level Community Awareness for Primary Schools on importance of Girls Education and Women Empowerment", under "Beti Bachao Beti Padhao" programme for all 366 Primary School at all 32 BACs of Sikkim from 08.03.2021 to 07.04.2021.

In these awareness programmes, at least 05 Girls students from class IV and V each, One Lady Teacher, Head of the Institution, SMC and Local Panchyats attended the programme. It was observed that the programme was very effective and fruitful for creating awareness amongst all Girls Students.

Resource persons had been drawn from Health Department, Social Welfare Department, Police Department and BDOs from the Block Administration Centre.

Various activities like essay competition, drawing competition, extempore speech competition and debates on the topic "Importance of Girls Education and women Empowerment' were conducted. Prizes, certificate of appreciation have been distributed to all participating Girls students in the programme.

# h) Yoga programme.

Under the intervention of Yoga under Samagra Shiksha, we have organized basic Yoga training of three days to the untrained teachers of South and West Districts, refresher training course of two days each for existing yoga trainers of all the districts (in phases) and celebrated International Yoga Day at all levels both online and offline. This year, we supplied Yoga Mats to all the Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools. We have organized Yoga Olympiad at all levels virtually.

The total financial sanction in the PAB under Yoga for 2020-21 was Rs 24 lakhs including winter football coaching.



# i) Self Defence Training for Girls.

Self Defence Training for girls of Class VI to Class XII of all the Government schools of Sikkim was proposed in the AWPAB 2020-21. Under this intervention, an amount of Rs 32.85 Lakhs was to train elementary level girls and Rs 17.82 lakhs for secondary girls was approved. The training programme was done in collaboration with the Sports and Youth Affairs Department, Government of Sikkim from the month of November 2020. A total of 140 Master trainers provided by the Sports Department who were experts in the field of various disciplines of sports were entrusted to impart the training to the beneficiaries. The training was conducted in all the JHS, SS and SSS of Sikkim and was successfully concluded as per the schedule.



### III. Activities under Samagra Shiksha (Secondary) in 2020-21

# Various Activities Covered under Samagra Shiksha- 2020-21 (Secondary)

- > Training of SMC and Community Mobilisation were conducted in all the schools.
- Organic farming intervention has been implemented in various schools.
- School Annual Grants has been provided to Primary, Jr High, Sec & Sr Sec Schools (including Monastic Schools) as per the norms.
- > Sports kits have been provided to all Schools under sports and physical education component as approved by PAB.
- Escort allowances for CWSNs have been distributed to the identified beneficiaries through DBT.
- ➤ Remedial Teaching under Learning Enhancement programme was provided to the identified students of class IV, VI and IX as per their competency level.
- Library books to all Primary, Jr High, Sec & Sr Sec Schools were distributed.
- ➤ Under Tinkering Lab provision, 60 Jr. High Schools have been provided hi end science equipment under robotics, etc.
- ➤ Kala Utsav, a talent showcase competition programme in the field of Visual Art, Music and Dance conducted in the districts, State and National level.
- > Continuation of services of Graduate Teachers for Maths, Science and Arts subject done.
- > Up gradation and strengthening work at various schools has been carried out during the year
- > Distribution of Teaching Learning Materials to schools to support pre-primary level.
- > Implementation of various trades under Vocational Scheme at 194 Sec. & Sr. Sec. Schools.
- ➤ Teacher Education Programme includes capacity building of in-service Teachers, Teacher educators, Heads of Schools, Academic Administrators BRCs/CRCs and Induction of newly recruited teachers.
- > SCERT as the academic authority at the State level and 3 DIETs at the District level provide academic support to this programme.
- Funding for Programmes and Activities under Teacher Education comes partially from Samagra Shiksha and partially from the State Government.
- Constructions of New School buildings at upgraded schools from JHS to SS
- > Strengthening of Schools by construction of library rooms, Computer rooms, repairs etc.

# **Vocational Education:**

Vocationalization of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education is functional in 194 Government Secondary/Senior Secondary Schools. Under these five vocational trades viz. Information Technology, Travel &

Tourism and Retail Trades, Food Production and MSFC are being run as per CBSE scheme of studies. Vocational subjects are being offered as additional subjects in class IX and X (Level I & II) and compulsory electives in class XI and XII (Level III & IV).

#### **Guest Lecture Sessions:**

Guest lecturer sessions were conducted for all trades for vocational students. Guest Lecture session is under the norms of NSQF. Such guest lecture sessions can also be an opportunity for the school to link with an industry/institution of higher education. Identification of guest lecturers from the reputed industry/business houses is important as their organizations maybe potential bridges between employers of the pass outs.

# Induction Training of ICT instructors:

10 day-long Induction Training was organised for all newly appointed ICT instructors and Project functionaries. Structural variations and computer-based teaching guideline had been discussed in those training sessions.

# **SCHOLARSHIPS & EXAMINATIONS**

The Scholarship Section of Education Department undertakes the implementation of scholarship schemes of both the State and Central Government.

The schemes implemented by the Scholarship Section, Education Department as per the school calendar 2020 are as under:

# (A) STATE GOVERNMENT SPONSORED SCHEMES.

# 1. Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme (CMMSS).

The State Government of Sikkim has launched the Hon'ble Chief Minister's Merit Scholarship Scheme in the year 2010. This scheme aims to provide *free education* to talented and deserving children from the underprivileged family background with an opportunity to study in reputed private schools both within and outside the State.

With the announcement made by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim during the Tendong Lho Rum Faat celebration at Geyzing on 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, (05) seats exclusively meant for Lepcha students from Dzongu Area has been added in the CMMSS from the academic session 2020. The five students of Dzongu Area will be admitted in Tashi Namgyal Academy. This has enhanced the yearl intake of CMMSS's students from 50 (fifty) to 55 (fifty five).

Screening test of Class V topper students to avail CMMSS for the academic session 2020-21 was conducted on 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2020 at Sir Tashi Namgyal Senior Secondary School, Gangtok and 55 students (22 boys and 33 girls) were selected through the existing reservation policy and admitted to various schools, forty (45) within Sikkim and ten (10) outside Sikkim.

During the financial year 2019-20, an amount of Rs. 7.00 crore had been approved and sanctioned for the reimbursement of school fees and other expenditure. A pending liability of Rs. 12.69 Crores is due for the FY 2020-21.

## **Board Examination Result.**

There are 138 students, who have appeared in the Class XII CBSE and ISC Board Examinations in March, 2020. Due to COVID 19 pandemic, Class XII Board Examination could not be conducted for all the subjects.

## 2. Extension of CMMS Scheme up to Graduation Level

With a view to provide consistent Government support to the students under CMMSS, to enable them to continue with their higher studies, the State Government has extended the said scheme up to the graduation level vide Notification No1136/Exam/HRDD dated: 28<sup>th</sup> March 2017. Till the Academic year 2020, 428 students are benefitted by this scheme. During the year 2020, 138 students have taken admission in different under graduate courses within and outside the State.

The scholarship for the students under extension of CMMS Scheme up to graduation level is being given in the form of reimbursement. In the financial year 2020, the scholarship grant of Rs. 96,54,304.00 for 264 students of 2017, 2018 and 2019 batches (Fresh & Renewal) has been released.

# 3. Merit and Prerna Scholarship Schemes for School Education.

- (a) Open Competitive Examination for Class V to award Merit and Prerna Scholarship was held on 26<sup>th</sup> February 2020 in 9 Sub-divisions of the State. For Merit scholarship scheme, three students are selected from the toppers of merit list. For the Prerna Scholarship scheme the next three girl students are selected from the same merit list prepared for each sub-division for the award of both the scholarship. A total of 54 meritorious students were selected for aforesaid scholarships at the Elementary Level.
- (i) For Merit Scholarship, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> positions were awarded @ Rs. 1200/-, Rs. 1000/- and Rs. 800/- per annum respectively in Classes VI, VII and VIII.
- (ii) For Prerna Scholarship, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> positions were awarded @ Rs. 800/-, Rs. 700/- and Rs. 600/- per annum respectively in Classes VI, VII and VIII.
- (b) At the Secondary Level, Merit Scholarship was awarded to students who secured 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> position at the District Level in Class VIII Annual Examination. Based on merit list, the next three girl students were selected for Prerna Scholarship at the District Level. A total of 24 meritorious students were selected for aforesaid scholarships at the Secondary Level.
- (i) For Merit Scholarship, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> position were awarded @ Rs. 1500/-, Rs. 1200/- and Rs. 900/- per annum respectively in Classes IX and X.
- (ii) For Prerna Scholarship, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> position were awarded @ Rs. 900/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 700/- per annum respectively in Classes IX and X.
  - Under Merit and Prerna scholarships scheme, an amount of Rs. 3.57 lakhs for 397 students(Fresh and Renewal) of 2018 & 2019 academic year was given in the year 2020.

## 4. Post Matric Scholarship.

The Post Matric Scholarship is granted to all local students under merit and general categories pursuing various courses within and outside the state.

# (a) MERIT SCHOLARSHIP:-

Scholarship ranging from Rs.800/- to Rs. 2,000/- p.m. is awarded to students who secure 80% and above in Class XII Board Examination or equivalent. The percentage is calculated from the scores of English and three main subjects. Further, annual reimbursement of maximum Rs.10,000/- is also awarded for some courses viz. MBBS/BDS, B. Tech/ B. Arch and some notified honors at graduation level.

# (b) GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP:-

All local students securing less than 80% but more than 60% are granted scholarship in selected courses as notified by the Department on submission of valid income certificate of Rs.10, 000/- per month or less for both parents. Further, annual reimbursement of maximum Rs.10, 000/- is also awarded for some courses viz. MBBS/BDS, B. Tech/ B. Arch and some notified honors at graduation level.

# (c) FELLOWSHIP FOR M.PHIL & PHD SCHOLARS:-

Scholarship is awarded for pursuing Ph. D courses @ Rs.6,000/- p.m. for regular candidates with subject related to the State of Sikkim with a contingency grant of Rs.15,000/- per annum for a maximum period of three years and Rs. 3,000/- p.m. for in-service candidates with reimbursement of Rs. 12,000/- per annum.

The post matric scholarship schemes for the FY 2015-2019(Fresh & Renewal) have been released in the year 2020-21. An amount of Rs. 18,68,798.00 has been released to the 68 beneficiaries through Direct Bank Transfer (DBT) to the their bank account seeded with Aadhaar.

# 5. Grant of Financial Assistance to Local Students admitted to Rashtriya Indian Military College (RIMC), Dehradun.

The scholarship section also grants the financial assistance to the local students studying in Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun at the rate of Rs. 20,000 /- per annum per student. The candidates have to qualify in the entrance exam conducted by the Home Department for the said Institute. The said exam is conducted twice in a year in the month of June and December.

At present, one student is studying in RIMC, Dehradun, the detail of which is given in the following table. The payment of scholarship for the cadet @ Rs. 20,000/- has been released for the academic session 2020-21.

# 6. Grant of Financial Assistance to Local Students admitted to Sainik School, Goalpara (Assam).

Financial assistance of Rs 20,000/- per annum per student is awarded to local students studying in Sainik School Goalpara, Assam. The names of two students studying under the

#### 7. Scholarship for Schedule Tribe girl students in Banasthali University, Rajasthan.

Girls under ST category of nine to ten years age group are selected and nominated for admission to Banasthali University up to Ph.D level in Hindi language. Currently, there are,16 students are studying under this scheme.

# 8. Award of Admission to Meritorious Girl Students passing Class IV to Him Jyoti School, Dehradun.

The scheme of admitting two meritorious under privilege Girl Students passing Class IV in Him Jyoti School, Dehradun was started in the year 2008. Under the scheme, the selected Girls are entitled for *Free Education* from Class V to XII.

Two students have been selected for Him Jyoti School for the academic session 2020 but due to Covid -19 one student declined to take the admission. The detail of admitted students

# (B) CENTRAL GOVERNMENT SPONSORED SCHEMES.

# 9. National Talent Search Examination (NTSE).

The purpose of the scheme is to identify talented students and nurture them. NTSE is meant for students studying in class X. There will be two-stage selection processes for award of scholarship, Stage I at the state level and stage II at the national level. The students who qualify stage I will be eligible to appear in stage II examination conducted by NCERT. The stage I examination was conducted at the district head quarters on 13<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2020. On the basis of stage I examination, 50 students were selected for stage II this year. The qualified students receive the scholarship from class XI up to PhD studies.

### 10. National Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS).

The centrally sponsored, National Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS) was launched in May 2008. The objective of the scheme is to award scholarship to meritorious students of economically weaker sections to arrest their drop out at class VIII and encourage them to continue the study at secondary stage. Scholarship of Rs. 12000/per annum (Rs. 1000/per month) per student is awarded to selected students every year to study in classes from IX to XII in State Government, Government aided and local body schools. The student whose parental income from all sources is not more than Rs. 1,50,000/- per annum are eligible to avail the

scholarship. There is reservation as per State Government norms. The students are selected for this scholarship through an examination conducted by Education Department, Government of Sikkim. Scholarships are disbursed by the State Bank of India, New Delhi directly into the Bank accounts (DBT) of students in quarterly basis. The selection test was conducted for the year 2020-21 in the four districts on 13<sup>th</sup> December,2020.During the year 2020-21, 58(fifty eight) students were benefitted by the scheme.

11. North East Council (NEC). Education Department has been extending financial support to the students pursuing higher education in professional courses under "Stipend and Book Grant" from NEC Shillong. The North East Council has been rendering financial assistant in the form of stipend and book grant to the students of North East States through the State Government including Sikkim since 2006. The assistance is given for Diploma, Degree, Post Graduation, M. Phil and Ph. D. courses. This scheme is now integrated with the National Scholarship Portal (NSP).


# **CBSE Examination**


In addition, Compartmental Examination was also supervised by Exam Cell and conducted in the District HQs during Pandemic.

# DISTRIBUTION OF FREE TEXTBOOKS & UNIFORMS

#### Introduction:

The State Government has introduced some beneficiary schemes for enhancing enrolment of students at the Primary and Elementary Stage so as to fulfill the national commitment of Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE). To achieve the goal of Compulsory Elementary Education and to provide quality education in the State, the Government has introduced many beneficiary schemes.

In this endeavor, the Textbook Section of Education Department, Government of Sikkim has been continuing with implementation of various schemes for the welfare of students of Sikkim as per the guidelines of the Government.

In compliance to decision of the Government, the department awarded stitching of 20004 numbers of Uniforms to Self-Help Groups through SRLM/RDD, Government of Sikkim.

The following beneficiary items are provided free of cost to the students of Government Schools as enumerated as under:

#### 1. SCHOOL UNIFORMS:

School uniforms are procured annually through e-tenders from the reputed and reliable local bidders and firms who fulfill the eligibility criteria.

(i) Annually distributed items- Pant, Shirt, Skirts, Tunic & Bakhu Set.

It is an annual scheme. Above mentioned School Uniforms were distributed to the students from Classes LKG to VIII of all Government Schools.

Total expenditure on School Uniforms is Rs. 3,39,40,698/= (Rupees Three Crores Thirty-Nine Lakhs Forty Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Eight)only.

(ii) Biennially distributed items-Raincoat, School Bag & Pullover.

The above-mentioned items are distributed biennially to the students of all Government Schools from Classes I to V and also to the students of notified Government Schools up to class VIII located at remote areas of Sikkim.

#### 2. TEXTBOOKS:

Free textbooks were distributed to the students of Classes LKG to Class VIII of all the Government Schools and 50% concessional rate from Class IX to XII.

#### 4. SHOES & SOCKS:

One pair of shoes and two pairs of socks are distributed free cost to the students from LKG to Class V of all the Government Schools and Classes VI to VIII of notified Government Schools located at remote areas from the Academic Session-2008 onwards.

#### **5. TEXTBOOKS USED IN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS:**

- (i) Textbooks for Classes I to V and English Textbooks from Classes VI to VIII prepared by SCERT.
- (ii) NCERT Textbooks for Classes VI to XII.
- (iii) Private Publishers' Textbooks in various languages like Nepali, Hindi, English Novels, Physical Health Education, Lab Manual etc are used for Classes LKGto XII.

- (iv) Braille books to Boomtar blind school, South Sikkim since Academic Year 2015 prepared by NIVH, Dehradun.
- (v) Textbooks prepared by Directorate of Elementary Education in LKG &UKG.
- (vi) Regional Language Textbooks are prepared by Language Section of the Department of Education for various classes.
- 6. Textbooks, Exercise Books, Uniforms, Shoes and Socks for the Classes I to VIII are procured through e. tender along with Bhutia, Lepcha and Limboo Language Textbooks up to the level of Class XII.
- 7. School Stationeries (Teacher's Attendance register, Student's attendance register, Teacher's Dairy, Transfer & character certificate etc) to all Government Schools.

#### 8. SYLLABI:

The Syllabi for Classes I to V and VI to VIII (English) are prepared by SCERT, Education Department, Government of Sikkim and for Classes VI to XII are prepared & published by CBSE Board, New Delhi.

# TEACHER EDUCATION IN SIKKIM

# (Programmes and Activities of SCERT)

SCERT being an academic authority of Education Department organizes various programmes and activities for in-service teachers, head teachers, teacher educators and students of the state. SCERT Sikkim also provides academic support to different sections of Education Department and other institutions of the state. Further, SCERT also works in collaboration with organizations and institutes of repute at the national and international level like NCERT, NIEPA, APU, MGIEP-UNESCO, New Delhi & Jodo Gyan.

Programmes and Activities organized by SCERT in 2020- 2021is broadly categorized into following categories:

- 1. Text Book, Curriculum Development and Publication
- 2. Programs for Professional Development of Teachers, Teacher Educators, Head of Schools, and Block and Cluster Resource Coordinators (BRCs & CRCs)
- 3. Conferences and Seminars
- 4. Educational Research
- 5. Participation of SCERT in Programmes Organized by National Institutes, Education Department, Govt. of India and other organizations outside the state of Sikkim
- 6. Academic Support to different sections of Education Department and other Institutions
- 7. SCERT as Nodal Agency for various National Programmes and Institutes

Brief summary of programs under each of the above categories is given below:

# 1. Text Book, Curriculum Development and Publication:

# Development & Completion of New Textbooks in EVS, Mathematics and English for classes IV&V

SCERT Sikkim with the academic support of Azim Premji University Bangalore has successfully accomplished the task of writing Textbooks for classes IV and V in Environmental Studies, Math and English during the second phase of textbook development process. The local designing firm, Echo stream were once again our partners in designing and illustrations.


The books were piloted in 40 pilot select schools of the state in the academic session 2020-21 for further improvement and refinement.

Curriculum Development in Organic Agriculture as a Skill Course for Classes VI-VIII SCERT in collaboration with Samagra Shiksha, Government of Sikkim has completed the development of curriculum in *Organic Agriculture as a Skill Course for Classes VI-VIII* for state government schools. The course, which will be part of the skill based vocational activity implemented by CBSE at the middle school level, is in alignment to the recommendation of NEP which emphasizes integration of vocational skills at the middle level. The main objective of the curriculum is to introduce learners to the basics concept of organic farming that will enable them to make an informed choice of studying Organic agriculture at a later stage. SCERT is working with Pandit Sunderlal Sharma Central Institute of Vocational Education (PSSCIVE) for the development of the curriculum. Presently, content development for the Handbook has also been initiated.



### SCERT Newsletter - "REFLECTIONS"-Series IV & V

A newsletter is essential for successful institutional operations and is a "mirror" of an institution and reflects on its operations. With this aim in mind, SCERT Sikkim launched its own newsletter on August 2016 and christened it as "REFLECTIONS" (As human life is all about reflections!). The newsletter comes out quarterly and carries round up of important activities of SCERT& other Directorates of Education. After printing, the news letters are delivered to all the concerned Directorates of the Department. During 2020-21, three issues of Reflections have been published.

### **Compendium:**

Fifth State Teacher Educator's Conference was organized by SCERT at Forest secretariat on 21<sup>st</sup>&22<sup>nd</sup> Jan 2020 having several education related themes. Around 20 research papers were presented by teacher educators from the varied institutions across the state. A compendium was prepared and published by SCERT in 2020-2021.

# 2. Programmes for Professional Development of Teachers, Teacher Educators, Block and Cluster Resource Coordinators (BRCs & CRCs)

SCERT regularly conducts various academic programmes and activities for professional development of in-service teachers and teacher educators of the state. Subject specific training programmes are organised on regular basis for in-service teachers teaching at different levels.

- III. SCERT also conducted orientation of student- teachers of DIET Gangtok on newly developed Textbooks of classes I-V.

- IV. SCERT organized an orientation on newly developed textbooks of Classes IV & V for pilot school teachers teaching Math, EVS and English.
- V. SCERT in collaboration with Azim Premji University, Bengaluru conducted Online workshop on Restructuring STET syllabus of Paper I and Paper II.

### **During Lockdown**

Maintaining strict COVID-19 protocol, an emergency meeting regarding prevailing situation due to existing "lockdown" especially in the schools of the state was held at SCERT on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2020. The meeting had the presence of Additional Chief Secretary, Director(s), School Education, Samagra Siksha/Primary Education and Director SCERT. Also present were JDs School Education and SCERT along with Principal DIET, Gangtok, faculty SCERT and DIET.

The agenda of the emergency meeting was to design various academic programmes through various social medias for the students and the teachers of the state during the Covid pandemic so that fruitful learning takes place in the homes of the children and the teachers. Details of the outcomes of the meeting are as follows:

Preparation of Subject wise Suggestive Unit Plans: Subjective wise suggestive unit plan for English, Math, EVS, Science and Social Science was prepared by SCERT and DIET for Elementary level and Primary Level respectively. In order to maintained the uniformity among all subjects at all level, it was decided that the Unit plan must have Learning Outcomes, duration, additional online resources and suggestive mediums like Whatsapp, Facebook etc.

Radio talk for teachers: SCERT Sikkim in collaboration with Samagra Shiksha, Education Department, Govt. of Sikkim conducted 15 "Talk Session" through All India Radio Gangtok from 12pm-1pm on every Monday, Wednesday and Friday in order to orient primary teachers on newly developed textbooks of classes I- III.

**Programme for students through mass media:** SCERT was given the responsibility to identify and nominate the teachers teaching at Primary and Elementary level from in and around Gangtok for various educational programmes for Students. Classes for Science and Mathematics were conducted through Samvaad TVwhereas, sessions on EVS, English and Social Science were broadcast through All India Radio, Gangtok.

Online support and orientation of teachers during the lockdown period – an initiative of SCERT Sikkim, with the academic support of Azim Premji University: Subject wise online weekly meeting were conducted with the teachers of pilot school regarding the newly developed textbooks of Classes IV & V on English, EVS and Math.

Training of West District Teachers as Health & Wellness Ambassadors: The four day "School Health and Wellness Ambassadors" online training programme for school teachers of 103 State Government Schools, 2 Central Government funded Schools and 1 NGO run School of West Sikkim (Aspirational District) was jointly organized by Population Education Cell-SCERT, Education Department and Rashtriya Kishore Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK) unit of Health Department, Government of Sikkim. The Health and Wellness Ambassadors have been created to cater for support and spread awareness regarding preventive health by organizing appropriate activity sessions of one hour every week in their respective schools to promote joyful and healthy learning.

### State Teacher Educators' Conference

Teacher Educators' Conference was organised by SCERT from 21<sup>st</sup>to 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan 2021 at Forest Secretariat, Deorali, Gangtok.

The main objective of Teacher Educators' Conference is to enable teacher educators to share and discuss pertinent issues related to teacher education and school education. It provides platform for discussing research areas undertaken by teacher educators in the state. It brings development of evidence-informed ideas on how to prepare schools, teachers and students for the changing demographics of schooling.

Around twenty (24) research papers were presented during the 2-day conference by participants from different educational institutes including SCERT, DIETs and Teacher education Institutes and colleges of the state. The key areas covered in this conference were: Primary and Elementary teaching- Problems & Prospect, Teachers training (pre and in-service): its challenges, Teacher education and contemporary issues, School management: role of Community, Inclusive education: problems & prospects, Linkages in school development, Policies and planning of teacher education- problems & prospects, Curriculum development, Innovative practices and Education for Sustainable development.

# 5. Academic support of SCERT during Evaluation, Examination and Recruitment process conducted by different sections of Education Department

As in the past years, during 2020-2021 also, SCERT did its part of assigned job when Directorate of Examination & Scholarship conducted several examinations – Like Hon"ble Chief Minister"s Merit Scholarship Scheme (HCMMSS) Examination, National Talent Search Examination (NTSE). It also supported to conduct final examination and entrance examination of D. El. Ed. Course conducted by DIETs.

The videos of the Folk Dance were shot by the participating schools and sent to respective co-ordinators of North and East districts. The videos were played live at respective control room of SCERT in the presence of judges also connecting with the participants, Heads, nodal teachers and other guests through google meet. Total of five Schools of North District and twelve schools from East district participated in the competition. The winning three schools from each district participated for the State level Competition.

- 4. The IT Section was able to restore internet connectivity to Government Arts College, Mangshila, Mangan with the intervention of District Magistrate (DM)/ North.
- 5. Last year, the school administration successfully conducted online exams for the students of Government Vocational College, Dentam, with the support of the IT section.

- 6. IT section has completed the task of collecting, compiling, and uploading all the notifications to date of the Education Department.

# **HIGHER EDUCATION & RUSA**

The Directorate of Higher Education being one of the pivotal Sections of the Education Department caters to equip the higher educational institutions in the State with all necessary resources and promote the quality of higher education by making necessary investments on infrastructure and faculty.

The State of Sikkim presently has thirteen (13) established Government colleges which are directly under the supervision of the DHE. The administration matters of twelve (12) Sikkim Government colleges are directly dealt by the DHE while also coordinating with the affiliating Universities of these colleges. Sikkim State Institute of Science & Technology is however directly under the supervision of the Directorate of Technical Education, Education department.

The State Government colleges in Sikkim and their year of establishment are as under:

- 1. Nar Bahadur Bhandari Government College, Tadong, East Sikkim- Estb. in 1977
- 2. Sikkim Government Law College, Burtuk- Estb. in 1980
- 3. Sikkim Institute of Higher Nyingma Studies (SHEDA), Pangthang (East Sikkim) Estb. in 1964
- 4. Sikkim Government College, Namchi- Estb. in 1995
- 5. Sanskrit Mahavidhyalaya, Samdong –Estb. in 1997
- 6. Sikkim Government College, Rhenock –Estb. in 2005
- 7. Government B.Ed College, Soreng Estb. in 2009
- 8. Sikkim Government College, Gyalshing –Estb. in 2011
- 9. Sikkim Government College, Burtuk Estb. in 2012
- 10. Sikkim Government Science College, Chakhung Estb. in 2017
- 11. Sikkim Government Arts College, Mangshila Estb. in 2017
- 12. Sikkim Government Vocational College, Dentam Estb. in 2017
- 13. Sikkim State Institute of Science & Technology- Estb. in 2018

In addition to these 12 colleges, there is one (1) Central University, one (1) State University and five (05) Private Universities established in the State of Sikkim. These Universities and three (03) private colleges though functioning as autonomous Institutions of higher education are also closely monitored by the DHE which acts as a regulatory body for these institutions.

The following have been the achievements of the Directorate of Higher Education in the F.Y 2020-2021:

1. **Establishment of new PG Departments in three Government colleges:** In order to meet up the higher number of students seeking admission for PG courses within the State, with the approval of the State Government and in collaboration with Sikkim University, the Department was able to introduce seven (07) new PG extension centres in NBBG College, SGC (Namchi) and SGC (Gyalshing) w.e.f the Academic session 2020-21.

The new PG centres were established in the following subjects:

- NBBG College Botany, Zoology and Chemistry.
- SGC (Namchi)- Commerce, Education and Geography.
- SGC (Gyalshing)- Political Science.
- 2. **Establishment of Morning shifts in SGC, Burtuk and NBBG College:** Owing to the pandemic a higher number of students seeking admission in the colleges located within the State was witnessed. 'Now, in order to allow access to all such applicants and accommodate them, morning shifts have been introduced by SGC, Burtuk and NBBG College (Tadong).
- 3. **Conduct of Online classes:** In view of the rapid spread of Covid-19 in the country, the Government of Sikkim as a precautionary measure closed all Educational Institutions in the State w.e.f the 17<sup>th</sup> of March 2020. Following this all colleges were directed to initiate classes using various modes of online communication. The same was followed by a quick response by all colleges and reports from the Head of Institutions relay that these online classes are proving quite effective. The conduct of these online classes is being monitored on a regular basis by the DHE.
- 4. Webinars conducted and committees established by various colleges during the pandemic: Webinars on various issues were organised by the colleges for the students and teachers. Further colleges also established internal committees for handling grievances of the students related to examination, other academic activities and mental health issues.
- 5. **Establishment of Centre of Excellence at Chakhung:** The State government has approved for establishment of a multi-disciplinary Higher Education Institution having choice based credit (CBC's) and multiple-point entry and exit system at Chakhung, West Sikkim. The Institution would function with Undergraduate (UG), post Graduate (PG) programs and also offer Doctorate and post doctorate research. The Institution has been named as the "Netaji Subash Chandra Bose University of Excellence" by the State Government. The foundation stone laying ceremony for the Institution was held on 24<sup>th</sup> of Feburary 2021.
- 6. **Establishment of a Buddhist University in Sikkim:** With the Kanchendzonga Buddhist University Bill being passed by the Sikkim Legislative Assembly, the first Buddhist University of the State has come into being.
- 7. **Nar Bahadur Bhandari Fellowship:** The Nar Bahadur Bhandari Fellowship Scheme which will be providing financial assistance to meritorious students securing admission in Masters or a Ph.D course in the World's top 20 Universities was also launched by the State Government on the 5<sup>th</sup> of October 2020. The scheme is to be operated by the DHE, Education Department with the selection of candidates being done by a Committee which has been especially constituted for this purpose.
- 8. **Coaching for UPSC aspirants:** The DHE in association with ALS Education Pvt. Ltd. is providing free coaching for UPSC examinations to fifty (50) IAS aspirants of Sikkim. Classes for the same are being held at NBBG College, Tadong.

- 9. Appointment of regular teaching faculty for Sikkim Institute of Higher Nyingma Studies (SIHNS/SHEDA): On the basis of the recommendation of Sikkim Public Service Commission and with the approval of the State Government, five (05) Asst. Professor on regular basis were appointed by the DHE for SIHNS (SHEDA).
- 10. Appointment of faculty required by the colleges on adhoc basis: Owing to an increase in the demand for additional teaching faculty in the colleges, a total of seventeen (17) fresh candidates were appointed by the DHE post their selection in an interview held for the said purpose.

### **Activities under RUSA**

In order to improve the gross enrolment ratio of higher education and make higher education relevant to global needs, MHRD launched Rashtriya Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) in the year 2013.

The main objectives of RUSA are as under:

- Improve access, equity and quality in higher education through planned development
- Usher transformative reforms
- Ensure academic and examination reforms
- Ensure adequate availability of quality faculty
- Improve equity for women, minorities and differently-abled
- Bring about affiliation and governance reforms
- Link guiding with reforms
- Mandatory accreditation
- Focus on research and innovation

The State of Sikkim joined RUSA in 2014 and thereafter the following steps have been taken in the FY 2020-21.

### **New Professional College**

Under the **New Colleges (Professional & Technical)** grant component, the civil construction of the Girls hostel, boys hostel, mess block and academic is in progress, physical progress of 20% for overall project is completed.

Under the **New Model Degree Colleges** grant component, the civil construction for the administrative and academic blocks of Chakung and Mangshila is in progress, overall 45% of construction is completed at Mangshila and 35% at Chakung.

### **New Professional College**

Fresh batch of students enrolled for B. Tech in civil and computer science engineering at the **Sikkim Institute of Science and Technology, Chisopani** using the administrative block while the academic block is under construction.

In the FY 2019-20 under RUSA 1.0, the State of Sikkim has received installments under components Infrastructure Grants to Colleges and Equity Initiatives which has been transferred to the respective beneficiary colleges. Workshops and remedial classes were conducted for the knowledge and awareness of the students.

Additionally, funds have been received under RUSA 2.0 for the component Infrastructure Grants to Colleges approved for five State Govt. Colleges in 16<sup>th</sup> PAB on 9<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Fund has been transfer to all the beneficiary college and the proposal

Under RUSA component Vocationalization of Higher Education, a computer literacy course is being conducted under Center for Research and Training in Informatics (CRTI) wing from the Department of Information Technology. The said course is approved by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)

# MID DAY MEAL PROGRAMME

National Programme for Nutritional support to Primary Education Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalization of Elementary Education by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting on nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary level (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was started in the State of Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (Rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry rations to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001- People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked Mid-Day-Meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

Cooked Mid-Day-Meal served to school children of Sikkim up-to Primary level (class I-V) from 2002 and from class (VI-VIII) are being provided from the academic session 2008, Though GOI norms don't cover the children of Pre-Primary classes for hot cooked meal but Sikkim had unique system of such pre-primary classes in all the Schools, these children were given hot cooked meal till the end of academic session of 2009 without any discrimination by the SMC of the respective schools.

Sikkim state has not come across with any major interruption except a few cases of slightly delay in reaching the food grains during monsoon sessions because of blockade of roads, however, with a view mitigate such problems the Heads of Schools are advised to keep buffer stock of food grains during such period.

### **OBJECTIVES:**

- The main aims and goal of the MDM Scheme in schools is to stop drop out from schools.
- Provide hot cooked meal in the schools so that the students can pay attention to their education.
- Develop healthy body by providing nutritious food.
- MDM shall stop gender disparities, social barriers.

### COVID-19 situation & mid day meal.

As the country is passing through the difficult times of Novel COVID-19 [Corona] outbreak The Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, New Delhi, as per the MDM Rules, 2015under the provision of **Food Security Allowance** [FSA] the all schools were provided dry ration viz: mustard oil, pulses, vegetables, mask & sanitizer in addition to food grains to protect children from 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2020 till 11<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2020. Besides that even summer vacation holidays of 06 working days has also been approved by the ministry as one time measure in order to safeguard the immunity of children.

The distribution process of dry ration at the school level were monitored by the BDO, block level officers of Education, SMDC, Local Panchayat, Cooking agencies, Teachers and Head of the institution.

### Awareness programme of MDM scheme at district level:

Awareness Programme of MDM at all the four district had been conducted by the MDM Cell, HRDD attended by Special Secretary, HRDD, Addl. Director [MDM] and officials from the department to sensitize the heads of the schools pertaining to entitlement under MDM, accountability, transparency, participation of stake holders and smooth functioning.

### Handbook of mid-day meal scheme

Handbook of Mid-Day Meal Scheme introduced by the State Project Office, MDM, Cell, HRDD containing all the Circulars, Guidelines, Formats and details of schools, complexes, BACs, etc has been distributed to all the schools, stake holders.

# TEACHING & DEVELOPMENT OF STATE LANGUAGES

The Directorate of Languages is entrusted for preparation of text books of all State and Regional Languages. It maintains the database of all language teachers (ad-hoc & regular).

The concerned officials of the Directorate prepared syllabus of all four major languages viz: Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo, Nepali along with Hindi and other endangered and Indigenous languages for Class I to XII. The four State languages especially Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo and Nepali are being taught at the University level.

The Bhutia section organised a Bhutia Folktales competition in collaboration with Denzong Kye-Rig Yargay Chogpa which was graced by the Hon'ble Education Minister as the chief guest. The competition programme was also attended by Hon'ble Minister RDD ven Sonam Lama and other dignitaries, literary figures and teachers and as well attended by officials from the Department.

A Google meet of the four major languages was conducted to assess the teaching learning process between the teachers and students during the COVID pandemic situation.

To further hone their skills, the concerned officials attended the webinar organized by SCERT in collaboration with Ajim Premji University on restructuring STET syllabus.

In order to inculcate a reading habit among the younger generation, a Book Fair was organized by Govt. of Sikkim at MG Marg with effect from 12<sup>th</sup> February 2021 to 14<sup>th</sup> February 2021. Book stalls of all languages were set up, folktales were narrated and poems were recited by the language teachers/officials during the function.

The confidential works pertaining to STET and CBSE (Class X & XII) was undertaken for the four major languages respectively.

The State Board of Indigenous and Endangered Languages of Sikkim conducted the Distance Mode of education examination of 5 languages viz: Rai, Tamang, Gurung, Sherpa and Manger for class IX & XI at TNSS, Gangtok on 22/11/2020.

Rai language section also organized a workshop on Rai language involving Rai teachers at Rai Manghim at Ranka.

The Tamang language in collaboration with Tamang Buddhist Association conducted a workshop on Tamang language regarding preparation of text books and syllabus in keeping with the guidelines issued by NEP-2020 w.e.f 25<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> November 2020. A district level Debate Competition was also organised on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2021 with a view to develop Tamang language.

Preparation/ Composition in under process of Rai & Manger language. Winter coaching class was held for Manger language teachers at Lingding, Pakyong (East) and VOK (South) on the same day of 31<sup>st</sup> January 2020 simultaneously.

Gurung language has completed editing Gurung dictionary assigned by CIIL. Newar language in collaboration with Newar Guthi conducted 5 days workshop on Teaching Methodology of New language from 25<sup>th</sup> February to 29<sup>th</sup> February 2020. A meeting with Director, Eastern Zonal Cultural Centre (EZCC) on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2020 regarding the development of Newar language. The ATBOs/ Co-ordinator of seven languages attended virtual training organised by JIO TV held at SCERT.

Preparation of Mukhia language text book for Class VIII in underway which will be introduced in 2021. Editing of all language text books has been done for reprinting. YouTube channel for Sherpa language has been created to provide virtual and digital assistance to aid in the learning/ teaching process.

Every month, virtual meet/ webinar has been scheduled to discuss about online classes and other related topics between language officials and language teachers of all languages.

Webinar on language learning under Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Programme at NIC, Gangtok was held on 24<sup>th</sup>February 2021.

## **Sanskrit Education:**

The Sanskrit section of Education Department achieved the following during the year 2020-21:

- 1. Approval for supply of text books (English, Nepali, Sanskrit and Hindi) to the Sanskrit Pathsalas for class VI-VIII has been approved by the competent authority.
- 2. Classroom/Office furniture were provided to the Sanskrit Pathsalas.
- 3. Filled in formats in respect to teachers appointed Rastriya Sanskrit Sansthan (RSS) were submitted for release of fund for the session 2020-21.
- 4. Proposal for appointment of Pradhan Adhyapak and Pradhanacharya in two Madhyamik and one Uchhatar Madhyamik Pathsalas has been approved.

# **TECHNICAL EDUCATION**

The Directorate of Technical Education has been functioning in the Education Department since 1998 and there has been considerable activity in this area. The importance of modern technology and the advent of the computer age have resulted in the urgent need to equip our students with adequate knowledge and exposure in these areas. The industrial growth in the State will to a large extent depend on the existence of a base of skilled technicians. The State Government has taken the initiative to meet these challenges and this is reflected in high priority it has accorded to and its policy statements on Industry and Information Technology and Education.

The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) is primarily charged with the responsibility for overseeing the functioning of the two Polytechnics namely Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC), Bardang, East Sikkim and Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT), Chisopani, South Sikkim established under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project for catering Diploma Engineering course in the State.

The Sikkim Institute of Science & Technology (SIST), Chisopani was established in the year 2017 and is currently running with two undergraduate programmes namely Civil Engineering and Computer Engineering.

### The State quota allotment was carried out by Directorate of Technical Education during 2020-21:

The department received a total of 1551 quota seats out of which 796 applicants were nominated. The Directorate achieved a breakthrough by taking the entire process online, from registration to payment of fees to scrutiny of documents to the allotment of seats. As per the need of the hour, owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, the online facility greatly facilitated applicants and guardians alike. This robust system is here to stay and would help the upcoming applicants pursuing their higher studies.



#### Rope-in Programme







#### **Academic Review and Monitoring**



ATTC also has its own Management Information Software, which has been instrumental in maintaining details such as student attendance, uploading of class notes, lectures, assignments which are accessible to all students and teachers. This software is also being used by the HODs to monitor the general conductance and interaction between the teachers and students.

Additionally, each class has its own whatsapp group with all the teachers and the HODs where pertinent information is being disseminated to all. The whatsapp group plays an important role where the students can easily and instantly reach out to their teachers in case of any doubts or clarification.

The Academic Incharge (AI) has been monitoring the class conduction by assessing the monthly class conduction report submitted by each Course Incharge (CIC) at the end of each month. An Academic Review Meeting is then called by the AI with all CICs and the Principal each month to assess the class conduction, syllabus coverage, sessional test performance and project completion status of each branch.

Any rating less than the desired 80% completion is looked into individually and the teachers and students are then asked to conduct extra classes to ensure that the subject conduction is brought up to par.

#### Class conductance and syllabus coverage of DM IV semester for the month of June 2021

The chart below shows the class conductance value (Kt value) for the month versus the cumulative class conductance till date versus the syllabus coverage for the second year students of Diploma in Mechatronics.

It is expected that the overall or cumulative class conductance value should be at least above 0.8 out of 1, which translates to 80% class conduction. The syllabus coverage also should be covered upto 90% by the teacher while the remaining 10% can be covered with the help of assignments given to the students.





Chart showing the previous class conductance for last month VS cumulative class conductance so far VS syllabuscoverage

The academic review and monitoring are done for each branch in the format represented below. The data reflects the total class conductance, total syllabus covered, pass percentage and CO attainment. The chart below is one such example of one branch viz. Diploma in Computer Engineering (DCE) to show how the performance chart of all the subjects are conducted year wise.

Alongwith the online classes, the students are also allotted Micro Project, Mini Project and Major Project for first year, second year and third year respectively. The project completion status is monitored for each batch by the respective project incharges and the following summary is submitted



Project completion status for Diploma in Mechatronics – II Semester (First Year)

ATTC has already completed two sessional tests for the current semester for all subjects through Google Forms where the students are asked multiple choice questions/subjective questions and are evaluated based on their

performance in the test. The internal criterion has been equated at 50 marks per subject while the remaining 50 marks will be evaluated in the semester examination for the students in second week of July 2021.



Result analysis of Diploma in Mechatronics – II Semester (First Year)

The result analysis is conducted for each sessional and the performance of students in every batch is analyzed. The graph leaning towards the left indicates that the students are failing as well as scoring lessin the exam. The graph leaning towards the right indicates that all students are scoring more in the subject and having less failures as well. However, an ideal graph will be one which has a mountain peak which indicates that the number of failures as well as very high scorers are less and maximum number of students have secured average marks in that subject.

As per NBA norms, each subject is also required to have a certain attainment value depending on the marks smedby the students in that particular subject. There are five levels of attainment – viz.,

- 1. Attainment level 1 is for students scoring between 40 to 45% of each particular course outcome of that subject.
- 2. Attainment level 1.5 is for students scoring between 45 to 49% of each particular course outcome of that subject.
- 3. Attainment level 2 is for students scoring between 50 to 55% of each particular course outcome of that subject.
- 4. Attainment level 2.5 is for students scoring between 55 to 59% of each particular course outcome of that subject.
- 5. Attainment level 3 is for students scoring greater than 60% of each particular course outcome of that subject.

The final internal result of the students is also analyzed for the attainment level calculations for each subject.

The mapping of Attainment Levels with the Course Outcome is an important marker in Outcome Based Education as per NBA guidelines



PART B: CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

#### **Covid Isolation Centre**

On 18th March 2020, the state government notified that all government and private educational institute shall remain close due to the arrival of Covid-19 virus in India. Soon after, the central government declared a nationwide lockdown on 25th March 2020. Following two-month long lockdown period from March, the state government notified ATTC as one of the Covid Isolation Centres for the returnees from various parts of the



nation from May–June 2020. Our institute served not only as the isolation centre for the returnees but also for the Covid recovering patients discharged from Multi- Specialty Hospital, Gangtok during the month of July-September 2020. The returnees had deeply expressed gratitude towards ATTC for the service during their stay in our campus.

I left Tezpur in Assam on 31st May at 5:00 A.M. with my friend Santosh Panth. It took us 16 hours to reach Sikkim. On reaching Rongpo's main entrance gate on the Sikkim border, we were sent to different Quarantine Centres. I was sent to the Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC) in Bardang, which is one Quarantine Centre, located on the campus of an engineering college. Santosh was sent to the Himalayan Boys Hostel in Majitar. We reached our respective Quarantine Centres safely, with the help of Sikkim Government, and also a school teacher, Shiva Kumar Sharma, who had driven us to Sikkim in his car. During this pandemic, we were lucky to chance on a person who helped us with just one call, and took care of us like his own family. I am eternally thankful for his help.

I stayed at the Quarantine Centre for 12 days, along with 62 other girls from various states in India like Delhi, Assam, West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, etc.

They were all students; all girls. This was a free Quarantine Centre provided by the Government.

Being in state-sponsored quarantine was a good experience. I learnt how people from different states had travelled and about their respective challenges. I was a little nervous about how I would be treated in the Quarantine Centre but on reaching the Quarantine Centre, I felt very safe and secure. People were extremely hospitable. On arrival, we were provided with one basket, a jar, a kettle, washing soap, hand wash, hand sanitizer, mineral water, sanitary pads, and anything else we might need. "Let us know whatever it is you need", is what they kept repeating. They even asked whether the salt in food was enough. We were taken care of like sisters who has returned home.

Breakfast time was eight o'clock. The food was quite delicious chapati with aloo dum, thukpa with boiled eggs and bananas for protein, with cups of tea. Lunchtime started at one o'clock and we were given rice, dal and at least four different types of vegetables, along with fruit like watermelon and pineapple. Five o'clock was teatime, and we had tasty snacks like sandwiches, phaley, momos, jhalmuri and cups of tea. Sometimes we would get chilled coke and ice cream. Eight o'clock was dinner time and we would get rice with dal and a variety of vegetables, sometimes biryani or fish curry.

After staying at the Quarantine Centre for a week, the CoVID-19 test was conducted. The total number of girls was 62 and of these, 54 girls were tested first. Their tests came negative so these girls then went to their own houses for home quarantine. After that, the remaining eight of us were tested.

On 11th June 2020, the reports came in and we were all negative. We clapped in relief and departed for our own homes in vehicles provided by the Centre. We were the last batch that got to be in a free Quarantine Centre. After us, those returning to Sikkim would have to pay and stay at hotels for Quarantine - in preparation for all the schools being re-opened by August 2020.











I am grateful to the Sikkim Government and ATTC Engineering College "backbone" for proving us with such good care. A special thank you to the Police Team, the Doctors Team, the ATTC frontline workers, and the staff and administration of ATTC namely, Sonam Palden Barfungpa - Principal Budha Bista - Lecturer & Warden, Vikash Mainali - Lecturer, Pempa Lepcha - Officer, Home Guards - Niraj Gurung, Karan Dhakal, Paras Mani Sharma, Karma Bhutia and Hira Lall Adhikari - Driver.



**PART C: EXTERNAL AICTE PROJECTS** 

#### Construction of AICTE sponsored SC-ST Hostel at ATTC Bardang

AICTE nominated ATTC as one of the beneficiaries for construction of AICTE sponsored SC-ST Hostel on March 2018. AICTE allotted ₹2,00,00,000 (Rupees two crores) for the project and released ₹1,00,00,000 (Rupees one crore) being the 1st installment as Grant-in Aid. The approved duration of the project was 3years.

Subsequently, tender was advertised in local newspaper and Mr. Anil Subba, a government contractor succeeded in acquiring the tender. The work order was released in February 2019 and the construction of the hostel commenced.

However, due to slow work progress, Mr. Anil Subba was notified for delay in work progress in February 2020. Since the approved duration of the project was 3 years and the 2nd installment of the project was yet to be released from AICTE, we submitted the work progress stating that the pandemic and nationwide lockdown from March 2020 hindered the work progress and we were unable to complete the Project within the stipulated date. We have thus requested AICTE to extend the duration for completion of the project owing to above circumstances.







#### Conclusion

While the pandemic has impacted all sectors hard for two years in a row now, it has been quite a challenge to impart education through online manner, especially when we deal with imparting quality technical education. Since practical classes form an integral component of our education system, ATTChas tried its best to conduct classes for its students, whether it be live classes or calling a few groups of students to the college during the months of January and February 2021 to conduct intensive practical classes for the higher semester students.

With the onset of the second wave, we have tried to establish as much dedication towards online teaching as possible by methods of constant monitoring and conduction of regular tests, assignments and quizzes for our students. We have successfully completed the even semester for the year 2021 in the month of June 2021 and have already scheduled our semester examinations for all students from 12th July 2021.

# CENTRE FOR COMPUTERS AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (CCCT)

#### I. INTRODUCTION

The year 2020-21 has been a challenge for CCCT due to COVID-19 pandemic. However, our college has been able to achieve and record many achievements and announcements which will lay path and direction for long term development of CCCT as a premier institute, providing Technical Education for the past 21 years to the youth of Sikkim and other states of India.

CCCT as a Government polytechnic was recognized in 2020 for achievements of great milestones and with the hope of numerous efforts put forth by the Government, both Centre and State along with Department officials, faculty, staff, students and parents plans to accelerate the institution towards the Vision of 'Techno Education for Global Competence'.



CCCT has maintained a trajectory of steady and sustained growth since its inception in 1999. The Institute's growth has been stupendous in terms of its infrastructure, academics, training and placement, new courses and programmes.

Currently, CCCT conducts 5 AICTE approved Diploma Engineering courses in:

- 1. Computer Science & Technology
- 2. Electrical & Electronics Engineering
- 3. Electronics and Communication Engineering
- 4. Civil Engineering
- 5. Mechanical Engineering

Extension of Approval (EOA) for 2020-21 was accorded to all courses with 255 sanctioned intake by AICTE. Further, AICTE has issued EOA for three academic years until 2022-23 to CCCT on account of NBA accreditation of 50% of courses.

The National Board of Accreditation (NBA) has accorded accreditation for three years to our Department of Computer Science and Technology and Department of Electrical & Electronics from academic year 2018-19 to 2020-2021. Furthermore, NBA has also accorded accreditation for the year 2021-22 for all the above mentioned courses. The work towards accreditation of the remaining departments, namely Electronics & Communication and Civil Engineering is also under progress and we do hope that within the next 1-2 years we can have all our departments NBA Accredited. With this, the Diploma certificate of our institute will be globally recognized as per the Washington Accord and the institute will be able to get more financial assistance in terms of infrastructure development, faculty development, and training and research projects from the Centre in future. It benchmarks the delivery of quality education and appreciates the methodology followed by CCCT to global standards.

Currently followed curriculum in CCCT are developed by NITTTR Kolkata and endorsed by State Board of Technical Education (SBTE), Education Department, Govt of Sikkim since 2015. The key highlights are as follows:

Credit point system and CGPA system leading to Diploma.

Focus on Soft Skill subjects like Professional Practices, Development of Life Skills, Experiential learning, Analytical skills, Core competency, Electives, Training on live industrial problems, hands on experience etc.

Number of Students enrolled in 2020-21: 586 of which Sikkim COI holders: 539 (92%) and number of girls: 243 (41%)

Number of students admitted in 2020-21: 180 including 24 under Lateral Entry to second year. We achieved 55% admission of the total sanctioned seats.

Placement of Students: 95% placed in 2018, 100% in 2019 and in 2020, only 15% placement recorded due to ongoing pandemic. Further, many students went for higher studies and have secured admissions under Lateral Entry to B. Tech/B.E. courses in various colleges including SIST, Chisopani.

The Annual Report of the CCCT portrays the wide spectrum of various academic and co-curricular activities at the Institute.

#### II. ACADEMICS

The Following activity have been planned and executed in CCCT for academic year 2020-2021. CCCT has referred the guidelines issued by UGC Dated 29.04.2020 and modification dated 06.07.2020

#### **ODD SEMESTER: September 2020 to March 2021**

#### 1. Beginning of ODD Semester:

- a. Online Classes for Second and Third year started from 1st September 2020.
- b. Induction program for first year students conducted from 14<sup>th</sup> September to 19th September 2020.
- c. Online Classes for first year Students started from 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2020
- d. A day of online classes consists of 4 hours of contact with theory and practical subject allocation from Monday through Saturday.
- e. A Time table and month-wise calendar is published for systematic and timely completion of in semester and end semester academic activities.

#### 2. Conduction of 1<sup>st</sup> Sessional examination

- a. First sessional test for second and third year students were conducted from 16<sup>th</sup> Oct 2020.
- b. First sessional test for first year students were conducted from 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 2021.

#### 3. Conduction of Offline classes and Practical Examination.

- a. Students who are willing to attend the offline classes and who are free from all type of Covid-19 symptoms were only allowed to attend these classes. However, these classes were not compulsory.
- b. The classes mostly comprised of practical and numerical subjects including internal and final evaluation (for practical subject). Remaining subjects classes were conducted in online mode.
- c. During contact classes the internal as well as external assessment of practical subjects were being completed. The students who did not attend these classes will be allowed to appear in examination of these subjects later when situation becomes normal.

#### 4. Conduction of second sessional examination Theory:

- a. Second sessional of theory subjects were conducted in a staggered manner from 1<sup>st</sup> week of February to last week of February
- b. Eligibility for all courses for end semester examination were declared on 9<sup>th</sup> of March 2021.

#### 5. Conduction of final theory and supplementary examination:

a. The schedule of final examination for all branches was from 15<sup>th</sup> March 2021 to 26<sup>th</sup> of March 2021, including practical supplementary.


b. The mode of examination was online take home examination and the question papers were of objective type. Platform used for online classes and take home examination was google class room. Examination was of 70 marks.


# **EVEN SEMESTER: 05 April 2021 to 28<sup>th</sup> August 2021**

#### 6. Beginning of Even Semester:


- a. A blended mode of delivery was planned and started from 05<sup>th</sup> of April 2021, with 50% students (section wise) in campus with both theory and practical classes and remaining 50% may attend theory classes from their respective station itself.
- b. The classes were conducted in above arrangement till 12<sup>th</sup> of April successfully and thereafter the students who were in campus were sent back to their respective places as per Govt notification. 09/SPD/SS/EDN/2021-22.
- c. While sending back the students from the campus, they were informed that the classes will be conducted as per time table.
- d. As soon as the lockdown got extended, the Academic calendar was modified and published online for the information of all students and staff.
- e. The teachers reported of conducting of around 90% of the scheduled classes as per timetable, however the attendance of students was not satisfactory (around 50%)
- f. To address the shortcomings of student's attendance Principal cum Director, Dr. B.B Pradhan address the students department wise. Thereafter, significant improvement in attendance has been noticed in the classes. 

**8.** For the conduction of online classes, the platform used are Zoom app, Google form, Google classroom, WhatsApp, and some of the classes were streamed in YouTube. The platform used for collection of assignment is Google classroom, for conduction of sessional test the platform used are Google form and Google classroom.

#### 9. Conduction of 1<sup>st</sup> Sessional examination

- a. First sessional test for second and third year were conducted from 21<sup>st</sup> May 2021.
- b. All tests were conducted and completed as per schedule and more than 90% of the students attended the sessional test.

#### 10. Planning for remaining semester

- a. If the situation and standing order remains unchanged, the institute will continue with the same modality with all Saturdays as working day which will give us minimum required no of days working and will be able to conduct semester examination in first week of August.
- b. Admission process for the first semester and lateral entry started from 1<sup>st</sup> may 2021. We are in the middle of the process; due to the restrictions of COVID-19 norms we are not able to do the physical movement and therefore the advertisement as well as the admission are done through digital mode. #### VI. Other major activities in the Institute

CCCT was identified as free facility quarantine centre and Covid Care Centre by South District Administration. Following premises of CCCT were used:
