Foreword

The Government of Sikkim has accorded highest priority to the education sector by providing an outlay of almost 20% of the State's budget and records have shown that much progress has been achieved, manifesting in remarkable performances by our students who have qualified for IAS, IPS, acquired doctoral and post doctoral degrees and are successfully employed in other parts of the country and abroad. This ratifies the efforts of the State Government in ensuring quality education to the children of the State.

The principal objective of the State Government's education policy is to ensure educationa facilities to all children above the age of four years. Quality education has been the key concern and driver to the Government's policies. The devolution of powers to Panchayati Raj Institutions in the management framework has added new dimensions to reforming the existing system of education and its management. The involvement of School Management Committees along with the Panchayati Raj Institutions has given a big boost to the bottoms up approach in planning.

Education per se has numerous indicators where in 'values' is of prime importance. While academic excellence speaks well of the modus operandi, the attitudes and values inculcated in the students speaks volumes about the intangible aspects of education. Our children have been taught to respect women and elders, maintain peace and harmony, show concern for the environment, maintain cleanliness and be of help to the society. Over and above maintaining its position of the most peaceful state, Sikkim today boasts of being the first state in the country to have achieved the 'Nirmal Rajya' status while the cleanliness in towns and cities is another story worth telling.

Governmental interventions have largely tried to address the following core issues aimed to provide accessibility, equity and ensure quality education across all socio economic groups in Sikkim:

- 1. Management of teachers and enhancement of teaching skills
- 2. Decentralisation and management at local levels for better involfvement and sustainability i. e. school based management
- 3. Technological innovations for maintaining latest teaching protocols such as facilitating education with the help of computers

4. Financing, supervision and support system for improvement of resources at all levels (both tangible and intangible resources)

As such, the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan scheme has brought back most of the out of school children back into the school system while incentives like the mid day meal scheme, free uniforms, text books, rain-coat, shoes and socks distribution have helped retain students in the school system. Schemes like the RMSA, being implemented at the secondary level, have added infrastructural support to accommodate a larger number of students in schools. It also has components relating to education of disabled children. The Shakshar Bharat Mission was launched in the State during the financial year 2010-11 to achieve 100% literacy by 2015.

Taking all the above approaches in pursuance to the education policy, various steps have also been taken by the government in the year 2014-15 to especially facilitate the teaching learning process. The Human Resource Development Department on its part has taken up the policies of the government for implementation in the year 2014-15. As such this report is a compilation of activities pertaining to various sections of the department.

CHAPTER 1 DIRECTORATE OF PRIMARY EDUCATION

1.1: Background:

Directorate of Primary Education was carved out from the Directorate of School Education with the prime objective of revamping the pre-primary and primary sectors in government schools. Having taken cognizance of the link between providing a strong foundation at the primary levels to the children and their performance at subsequent levels, this directorate came into existence in late 2013 vide notification no. 168/HRDD/(HQ) dated 20/09/2013. Since the quality of education imparted during the primary years lays the foundation for continuous learning, creation of conducive environment for learning becomes imperative.

Out of about 76 government schools in the state, about 400 are stand-alone primary schools.

1.2: SWOT analysis of government run pre-primary / primary schools:-

1.3: Restructuring Plan

In proposing to align priorities to overhaul the pre-primary and primary education sector, this Department anticipates meaningful collaboration and convergence with several related Departments like Health, PHE, RM&DD, SJE&WD, LR&DMD, UD&HD etc. Having thus settled for cradle to grave approach of planning to spruce up this sector, District-wise perspective plan has been prepared to ensure relevant and contextual remedial measures.

The proposed restructuring plan would encompass the following thrust areas:-

1.3.1: Teachers and their training needs.

1.3.2: Physical infra structure:

- i. Provision of hazard proof school buildings including MDM kitchens
- ii. Separate toilets for girls and boys
- iii. Uninterrupted water supply for drinking/cooking/sanitary requirements
- iv. Boundary walls/fencing for all schools.
- v. Playgrounds
- vi. Well-stocked libraries/sports kits/materials/TLMs
- vii. Ramps for CWSN under inclusive education
- viii. Furniture/Fixtures and other utilities
- ix. Utensils for MDM

Each district office has prepared its perspective plan for all schools raising vital issues which need to be addressed on priority for providing better learning environment for the school children as mandated by RTE Act, 2009. The main issues raised by district administration are training of teachers, creation of infrastructure like construction of school buildings, playground, fencing and boundary wall in school compounds, construction of MDM sheds, ramps, toilets, supply of drinking water, repair of old water connections, supply of furniture, electrification of school buildings and supply of white boards to some primary schools.

1.4: Achievements1.4.1: Interaction of the Hon'ble Minister, HRDD in districts

Interactive sessions of all school heads in their respective districts with the Hon'ble Minister for HRDD were organised by the Directorate of Primary Education with the caption *'Quality Education, Shaping the Nation'* that were held in Pakyong in the East, Mangan in the North, Gyalshing in the West and Namchi in the South Districts.

Teachers, school heads and several stakeholders took active participation and came up with several ideas and opinions which have been incorporated in the planning of curriculum, TLMs, academic activities and other related matters.

1.4.2: Training of primary teachers to teach mathematics in primary classes

Trainings of primary teachers in teaching Mathematics in primary classes were conducted. Such trainings were organised in all the GVKs of Sikkim wherein 45 resource persons imparted training to approximately seven hundred primary teachers.

1.4.3: Learning visit to Singapore and the Philippines

A delegation from the department headed by the Honorable Minister and accompanied by the Honorable Advisor, along with the Principal Secretary, Directors of School Education, Primary Education and Joint Director of Higher Education visited several schools in Singapore wherein they visited the National University of Singapore, Singapore Teachers' Institute, LKY School of Public Policy etc. Several schools and educational institution of higher education and teacher training in the Philippines were also visited by the team from January 10 to 18, 2015. Learning lessons from the visit are actively being considered for planning academic activities, designing the curriculum and for training and skill upgradation of teachers.

1.5: Future Plans

1.5.1: Introduction of LKG and UKG in schools

An important decision for introduction of kindergarten (LKG & UKG) classes for children of ages of 4 - 5 years from the academic session 2016 has been taken. 31 schools from 31 GVKs have been identified as pilot schools for initiating this project.

CHAPTER 2 SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (Universal Access to Elementary Education)

2.1: Background:

RTE Act 2009 provides children in the age group between 6 to 14 years access to free and compulsory elementary education within a defined area or limits of neighborhood. These areas or limits of neighborhood within which a school has to be established by the state government or local authority have been defined under Rule 4(1) of the RTE Act, 2009 of the Government of India. There are 866 habitations in the state and all of these habitations are served by primary level schooling facilities. However, there are 7 habitations still to be provided with upper primary level schools. There all together 1217 schools in the state.

Out of 767 schools under state government management, 62 primary schools are established under SSA and 98 upper primary schools were upgraded and 98 existing primary schools are upgraded to upper primary level since the inception SSA in the state. In addition, 79 institutions are being run by Social Justice & Empowerment Welfare Department known as monastic schools. Two primary teachers for each institution are provided under the SSA scheme for imparting modern education to the monk students in addition to their regular religious studies. At present there are 79 monastic schools operating in the state.

Enrolment of boys at primary level is 52.7% and that of girls is 47.3% suggesting that the enrolment of girls at primary level is 5.46% less than that of boys. The position is just opposite at the upper primary state i.e enrolment of girls is 2.59% more than that of boys. Overall enrolment at elementary level has decreased by 9293 which is 7.7% as calculated from previous year base figure i.e 120101.

Out of the 1,10,808 children enrolled in the elementary stage of schooling, 75 518 children (68.2%) are in 767 schools under the management of HRD Department. The stage wise and gender wise break up of these children is shown in table below:

CHAPTER 3

RASTRIYA MADHYAMIK SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RMSA)

3.1. Background

Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan was launched in 2009-10 as a community based initiative for achieving universal secondary education in the country. The objective is to provide equitable and quality secondary education to all children up to the age of 14-16 years and higher or senior secondary education to all children up to the age of 16-18 years. The vision is to make good quality education available, accessible, affordable and providing equal opportunity to all young persons in the age group of 14-18 years while maintaining gender parity. The pattern of fund sharing is 90:10 wherein the Central share is 90% and that of the State 10%.

The thrust areas of this scheme are:

- To establish a secondary school within a reasonable distance of habitation
 Ensure universal access of secondary education (GER of 100%), and universal retention of students,
- Providing access to secondary education giving special attention to children from economically weaker sections of the society, the educationally backward, girls and differently abled residing in rural areas and from other marginalized categories like SC, ST, OBC, etc.
- Providing physical infrastructure in schools.

This Directorate deals with the senior secondary and secondary schools in the state and the list of the 163 schools covered under the RMSA is shown in table 3.3.

3.2: Achievement on the targeted AWB &P, 2014-15

- 1. Annual school grant (recurring) of Rs. 25,000/- per school to all 161 secondary and senior secondary schools (district wise list is enclosed in table 3.4) amounting to Rs. 40,25,000/- was released with guidelines. The fund was transferred to the schools through RTGS and direct cheques to the SMDC.
- 2. Minor repair grant of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand) only was also released to the 161 schools against the total sanctioned amount to Rs. 40, 25,000.
- **3.** The utilization certificate along with audited statement of accounts for the year 2014-15 issued by the chartered accountant was submitted to the MHRD, Government of India.

3.3: In-service teachers' training

Training was conducted for in-service teachers of secondary and senior secondary schools for 10 days, conducted at the Sikkim Government College auditorium, Tadong. The district wise participants are illustrated in Table 3.2. Newly recruited teachers from the four districts participated and the training was conducted by resource persons from SCERT. The training was given on core subjects, RTI Act, innovation in quality education, open book exams etc. An amount of Rs. 2, 41,500/-(Rupees two lakhs forty one thousand five hundred) was sanctioned to conduct the training.

3.4: Sports Equipment

Sport Equipments was distributed to 56 schools at the rate of Rs. 20,000 per school. The total amount sanctioned was Rs. 11, 20,000/- The list of schools is given in table 3.5.

3.5: Book Fair (READ & LEAD)

A district level book fair "READ & LEAD" was conducted in the four district headquarters with a vision 'to reach out to every student in Sikkim and inculcate the habit of reading good books'. Students from most remote schools benefitted largely and over 15000 students from all over the state took this as an opportunity to enhance their reading skills. The sanctioned amount was Rs. 4, 00,000 (Rupees four lakhs).

3.6: Excursion Tour (outside the state)

Excursions for students from very remote schools in each district were conducted to different places in West Bengal. An amount of Rs. 4,00,000 (Rupees four Lakhs) was sanctioned for the purpose. This exposure benefitted the children from remote villages.

3.7: Civil works (non-recurring component)

Already sanctioned civil works of the preceding years were carried out in 2014-15. An orientation Programme was held for all the officers of State Project Office, District Project Office, School heads, Engineers from HRDD and SMDC members. They were sensitized on how to carry out civil works. Some schools were provided with ramps, railing and resource room under the IEDSS scheme i.e. Inclusive Education of Disabled Students at Secondary Stage.

Chapter 4 INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

4.1 Background

Information & Communication Technology (ICT) project in school was started with the aim to impart computer education to all the students of secondary and senior secondary level. ICT is universally acknowledged as an important catalyst for social transformation and national progress. Understanding and leveraging ICT is critical for the State's continued social and economic progress. While it is one of the components of RMSA Scheme, the primary objective of the ICT project is to increase computer awareness in students by motivating all teachers to take classes through computer and supported materials.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has provided an opportunity to students as well as teachers to transform their practices by providing them with improved educational content and more effective teaching and learning methods. ICT has been designed, planned and developed for the students so that they can learn computer to increase IT (Information Technology) skills in a computerized learning environment. ICT project is not continuing through particular syllabus oriented computer classes and board examinations, moreover ICT project curriculum has been set up to increase computer awareness among the school environments across the country. ICT syllabus developed by NCERT is being followed at all the schools under the ICT project.

4.2 Objective

The following diagram illustrates the objectives of the ICT project:



4.3 Project overview

The project in Sikkim covers 46 schools of which 32 are senior secondary and 14 secondary. All schools have separate room for conducting ICT classes, which have been refurbished painted and renovated with proper electrification. 46 instructors have been recruited i.e. one for each school.

4.4 Recruitment of ICT instructors

One instructor each has been recruited for 46 schools covered under the ICT project. ICT teachers coordinate with the school heads for implementation of ICT education in each class. They apprise the school heads and other teachers about the guidelines and norms of ICT @ School project. All the needful devices and materials are sent to each school covered under the project. The job description of an instructor under project is as follows:

- 1. To conduct computer classes (theory and practical), monthly and terminal tests and evaluate student performance. ICT technologies must be effectively used in the delivery of learning and teaching.
- 2. Submission of monthly progress report through school heads.
- 3. Maintain hardware, software and accessories and ensure system is functional all times in all computer systems.
- 4. Strict and regular maintenance of equipments, text materials and other inputs from the head office in the stock register. In case of any damage/loss kindly report to the head office immediately.
- 5. Regular updating of skills /knowledge keeping pace with the latest trends.
- 6. To ensure the development of students ICT, literacy and numeracy skills through the subject where relevant.
- 7. To regularly monitor, assess and evaluate student's progress and keep appropriate records.
- 8. Filling up student's data and submission to head office in time.
- 9. Maintenance of student and faculty attendance register.
- 10. Submission of quarterly inventory status report.
- 11. Special awareness must be upon:
 -) Personal knowledge and skill increment.
 -) Critical but smarter way of scheduling classes by synchronizing all class schedules of CBSE.

-) Innovation of new study materials from internet daily so that better materials can be visualized to the students.
-) Be aware regarding function of all teachers in computer environment and recharge of the internet connectivity.
- Any meeting or seminar from the implementing agency or HRDD must be attended to be updated regarding ICT project.

4.5 Course curriculum of ICT Project

Computer related ICT syllabus has been developed by NCERT which is being followed at all the 46 schools covered under ICT Project. A monthly test is conducted to assess the performance of students in computer skills. At the end of the academic session examinations are conducted for each class.

4.6 Educational Software and Textbooks

CDs with educational content, software tools and CDs with ICT computerized learning materials are provided to the instructors to deploy operational activities at schools . Following are the basic software tools given in the CDs:

Chapter 5 ENGINEERING CELL

As such 127 students were admitted to various schools (101) within Sikkim and (26) outside Sikkim, raising the total number of students/ beneficiaries under the scheme to 624.

6.4: Scholarship Examinations (NTSE and NMMSS)

6.4.1: National Talent Search Examination (NTSE)

National Talent Search Examination scholarship was constituted in 1963 by NCERT. It is one of the most prestigious scholarships in India and is also considered one of the toughest scholarships exam in India. NTSE is for students of Class 10 and is conducted in two stages. Lakhs of students pan India appear for the exam of which around 1000 students are awarded scholarships. The selected students receive scholarship from Class 11 till their PhD studies. It is a merit based scholarship and not a means based scholarship. NTSE exam can be taken by Indian students and by Indian students studying abroad. NTSE stage I exam is generally held in the month of November and the students who qualify the exam appear in NTSE Stage 2 which is conducted at national level by NCERT.

6.4.2: National Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS)

This scheme was launched in May, 2008 and the objective of the scheme is to award scholarship to meritorious students of economically weaker sections to arrest their drop out at class VIII and encourage them to continue the study at secondary stage. Scholarship of Rs. 6000/- per annum (Rs. 500/- per month) per student is awarded to selected students every year for study in classes from IX to XII in government aided and local body schools. There is quota of scholarships for different states /UTs. Students whose parental income from all sources is not more than Rs. 1,50,000/- are eligible to avail the scholarships. There is reservation as per state government norms. Students were selected for the scholarship through an examination conducted by the State Government / UT administration along with the National Talent search Examination(NTSE) Stage –I examination. From 2014 -15 onwards, separate examination for selection of students for NMMS Scholarships is conducted by the states. Scholarships are disbursed by the State Bank of India directly into the accounts of students on quarterly basis.

The National Talent Search examination along with National Means cum Merit Scholarship examination for the year 14 -15was held on 16th November 2014. 24 students were selected from the first level NTSE and the names were forwarded to MHRD for the second level examination which is conducted by NCERT itself. 56 students (as per roster) from Sikkim were selected for the NMMS.

6.4.2: Class V merit /Prerna Scholarship examination

A total of 54 students are selected every year for the award of general merit and Prerna scholarship. Six students, three on merit and three from amongst the girls for Prerna scholarship are nominated from each sub-division for the award of scholarships. The exam was held on February 25th, 2015 across the state and 54 meritorious students were selected.

6.5: Registration of private schools and private tutorials/authentication of certificates

The Examination Cell of Human Resource Development Department also looks after the registration of all private schools, private tutorials and authenticates university certificates within Sikkim.

6.6: Teachers Eligibility Test (TET)

 Teachers' Eligibility Test was held for the first time for graduate and primary teachers and a total of 821 candidates appeared for the test held on 24th November 2013 of which 278 candidates passed.

The category-wise details are as under.

-) For Graduate (Humanities)-143 candidates out of the 483 who appeared passed the exam
- For Graduate (Science) -23 passed out of 66 who appeared.
- *For Primary -112 passed out of 272 who appeared.*

CHAPTER 7 HIGHER EDUCATION

7.1: Background

The Directorate of Higher Education, Human Resource Development Department deals with administrative matters pertaining to government colleges, functions as a regulatory body for private universities and all recruitments in regular establishment under HRDD is done through this disrectorate.

7.2: Initiatives

During the year 2014-2015 the Directorate initiated the following:

- 1. Implementation of Rashtriya Uchchatar Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA) MHRD Government of India which was launched in 2013 in order to improve the gross enrolment ratio (GER) of higher education by providing access to quality higher education and make it relevant to global needs. RUSA proposes a new approach of funding which is based on principals of performance, incentivitizing well performing institutes and establishing a reliable Management Information System (MIS). The Government of Sikkim has submitted its willingness to participate in RUSA w.e.f. 08/07/2014. The Department has also made a state higher education plan and submitted it to MHRD, Government of India. The department has also received preparatory grants under RUSA and grants for infrastructure improvement, equty initiatives and vocationalisation of higher education one engineering college in south Sikkim has also been sanctioned.
- 2. Dissolution of EIILM University: The State Government on account of various complaints received against EIILM University dissolved the university, in accordance with the powers conferred under section 47 of EIILM University Act, 2006.
- 3. The Directorate has created one post of Principal and 134 posts of Assistant Professor in various subjects of different colleges vide notification no: GOS/HRDD(HE)/270/2014/144 dated: 28/01/2015 up of these posts. Proposal for filling up these posts on need basis is under process.
- 4. IT equipment has been given to all the government colleges for establishment of computer laboratories.
- 5. In pursuance of directions issued by MHRD, the directorate constituted the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE), State Cell vide notification no: 3084/DIR(HE)/HRDD dated: 17/02/2014. The scheme was introduced by the Ministry for generating reliable data on annual basis for evidence-based policy making and effective planning of the higher education system. All the higher education institutes of the state have successfully completed data submission for the year 2010-11-12, 12-13 and 13-14. Survey for the year 14-15 is presently under progress.

An amount Rs. 1, 04,000 was reimbursed to Shri Meg Nighi Dahal under UPSC scheme for clearing the UPSC prelims 2014.

The Directorate appointed twenty-seven (27) Assistant Professors on adhoc basis in various subjects for different colleges.

CHAPTER 8 TECHNICAL EDUCATION

8.1: Background

The Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) is primarily charged with the responsibility to oversee the functioning of the two polytechnics namely ATTC and CCCT established under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project. The Directorate also deals with imparting computer education in schools in the State under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of the MHRD, Govt. of India.

The DTE also is administratively charged with dealing with matters relating to Sikkim Manipal University, and its constituent colleges, namely Sikkim Manipal Institute of Technology (SMIT) at Majhitar and the Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences (SMIMS) at Tadong. The administrative functions of the Scholarship Section, DIET, SCERT is also managed by the Directorate of Technical Education.

8.2:Grants-in-Aid out of the State Plan to the two polytechnics ATTC & CCCT

Under the World Bank assisted Third Technician Education Project, two polytechnics namely Advanced Technical Training Centre (ATTC) and Centre for Computers and Communication Technology (CCCT) have been established. The Project period was from January 2001 till June 2007. During the Project period all expenditure relating to civil works, equipments, furniture, books and LRs, vehicles, consultancy charges as well as recurring expenditure on account of salary, consumables and operation and maintenance were fully borne under the project. After the termination of the project period on 30th June 2007, the polytechnics are functioning as autonomous bodies and they have also been recognized as societies under the state government. In order to maintain the huge infrastructure generated under the project, grants in aid will have to be given by state government to support the polytechnics till they are self sustainable.

8.3: Establishment of NIT

One NIT was established and is functioning with three streams at Ravangla on land provided by the State as a temporary campus. 300 acres of land has been identified at Khamdong for which necessary administrative approval for acquisition has already been obtained.

CHAPTER 9 TEXT BOOK & UNIFORM

9.1: Background

The state government has introduced some beneficial schemes for enhancing student enrolment at the elementary levels so as to fulfill the national programme of Universalisation of Elementary Education (UEE) and to achieve the goal of Compulsory Elementary Education. In this endeavor, the Textbook Section has been implementing various schemes for the school students of Sikkim. Accordingly, beneficiary items are provided free of cost to the students of government schools enumerated as under:

9.2: Distribution of School Uniforms

9.2.1: Annually distributed items- Pant, Shirt, Skirts, Tunic & Bakhu Set.

This is an annual scheme. The above mentioned school uniforms are distributed to the students of all government schools from pre-primary classes to VIII in government schools located at remote area upto 2009 and from 2010 onwards Classes I to VIII students of all the Government Schools.

9.2.2: Biennially distributed items-Raincoat, School Bag & Pullover

The above mentioned items are distributed biennially to the students of all Government Schools from classes I to V and also to the students of notified government schools upto class VIII located in remote areas of Sikkim.

9.3: Exercise books

Exercise books are also distributed free of cost to students from classes I to VIII in all government schools.

9.4. Distribution of textbooks

Free textbooks are distributed to the students of classes pre-primary to V upto 2009 and from 2010 onwards pre-primary to class VIII of all the government schools and at 50% discounted rate from class IX and above.

9.5. Distribution of shoes and socks

One pair of shoes and two pairs of socks are distributed free of cost to the students from classes I to V of all the government schools and classes VI to VIII of notified government schools located at remote areas from the academic session 2008 onwards.

9.6. Textbooks used in Government Schools

- i. Departmental language textbooks prepared by SCERT for classes I to XII in consultation with the language section of the HRDD.
- ii. NCERT textbooks for classes VI to XII.
- iii. CBSE textbooks for classes IX to XII.
- iv. Private publishers' textbooks in various regional languages like English,Physical Health Education, Lab manual etc are used for classes I to XII.

CHAPTER 10 MID DAY MEAL

10.1: Background

The national programme for nutritional support to primary education the "Mid-Day Meal Scheme" was launched as a centrally sponsored sheme on 15th August, 1995 in a phased manner all over India. Its objective was to boost "Universalisation of Primary Education by increasing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously impacting the nutrition of students in primary classes". The programme originally covered children of primary levels (classes I to V) in government, local body and government aided schools. In October 2002, the programme was extended to cover children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) & AIE centers and from the same year the hot cooked meal was initiated in Sikkim. Prior to the year 2001-02 the food grain (rice) provided by the Government of India @3kgs per child per month for 10 academic months in a year, was distributed as dry ration to the children. However, the Supreme Court in its order dated: 28.11.2001 in WP(C) NO. 196 of 2001- People's Union for Civil Liberties versus Union of India and other, directed all the state governments to provide cooked mid-day-meal containing 300 calories and 8 to 10 grams of protein per serving.

Cooked mid-day-meal is being served to school children of Sikkim up-to primary level (class I-V) from 2002 and to children of class VI-VIII from the academic session 2008. Though GOI norms donot provide for children of pre-primary classes for hot cooked meal, pre primary students in Sikkim are covered under this scheme. No major problems have been faced for the smooth implementation of this scheme except during monsoons where there is a delay in arrival of the food grains. However, to mitigate delay, heads of schools are advised to keep a buffer stock of food grains during the monsoon months.

10.2: Transfer of funds

From the academic year 2014, funds under the Mid-Day Meal Scheme are transferred to the MDM accounts of respective schools after obtaining en-bloc sanction of the Government. The "GREEN CHANNEL SCHEME" was introduced, which helps in transfer of the funds to school accounts in a quick manner. In addition to this, a separate MDM web-portal has also been introduced to generate the e-bill. The cooking cost and honorarium to cooks and helpers are also transferred to the respective school accounts.

10.3 Awarness programme of MDMS at district level

Awareness programmes of stake holders, heads of schools, cook cum helpers under MDMS are conducted in all the four districts by resource persons and nutritional experts which are attended by the district authorities and officials from the department to sensitize the heads of the schools pertaining to entitlement under MDM, accountability, transparency, participation of stake holders and smooth functioning of the scheme.

10.4Handbook of MDMS

A handbook on the Mid-Day Meal Scheme introduced by the State Project Office, MDM, Cell, HRDD containing all the circulars, guidelines, formats and details of schools, complexes, BACs, etc. has been distributed to all the schools and stake holders.

10.5: Food Menu:

Keeping in view the local context, the heads of schools and members of the School Management Committee (SMC) have been given freedom to decide the menu of the cooked meal. In most cases items being served are Khichdi atleast twice a month, rice, dal and green organic vegetables available locally.

10.6: Food Grains:

Rice is provided at the rate of 100gms/per child per working day and 150gms/per child/day for upper primary children by Government of India, New Delhi.

10.6.1: Transportion of foodgrains to schools

Reimbursements of bills are made on the basis of the food-grains supplied to schools as per the allocation as well as receipt of the school's head through the Joint Directors of the respective districts. Districts hire transporters for uninterrupted supply of food grains from Food Corporation of India's Godown, Rangpo for the North and East districts and Jorethang for South and West districts.

10.6.2: Construction of kitchen sheds

MHRD, Government of India released Rs.333.00 lakh for the construction of kitchen sheds to 555 schools @ Rs. 60,000/- per school during 2007-08 and the state provide Rs. 144.26 lakh @ Rs.27850/- per school as state share. Of this 518 kitchen sheds in schools schools against 555 have been constructed during 2007-08. The balance amount is lying with the state government .

The MDM Cell, has obtained sanctioned and approval of Rs.57.60 lakh to execute the construction work of 96 new kitchens cum stores to include Sanskrit pathshalas and monastic schools of Sikkim from 2011-12 fiscal year. 77 units of reconstruction of kitchen cum store under MDM that was sanctioned during 2013-14 amounting to Rs.187.71 lakh (inclusive of 10% state mandatory share) have been completed.

10.6.3: Management, monitoring & evaluation (MME)

Management, Monitoring & Evaluation is being carried out as per the guidelines of the GOI. The 2nd meeting of the State Level Steering cum Monitoring Committee was held on 25th Nov, 2014 under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Government of Sikkim.

CHAPTER 11 DISTRICT INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING (DIET) & DISTRICT RESOURCE CENTRE

11.1 Backgound

Sikkim operates three government run teacher education institutions and conducts the preservice two years diploma programme in elementary education, 'Diploma in Elementary Education' (D.El.Ed.). These institutions are 90% centrally sponsored scheme under Teacher Education from the financial year 2012-2013, receiving grants from the MHRD, Government of India. The institutes are:

- *J* District Institute of Education and Training (DIET), East, Gangtok
- J District Resource Centre (DRC) South, Namchi
-) District Resource Centre (DRC), West, Geyzing.

The former Teacher Training Institute (TTI) was up-graded to DIET, Gangtok in 1989 and caters to two districts i.e. East & North for different kinds of training programmes over and above the regular 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed.). The D.El.Ed was introduced in DIET Gangtok in 2003. The District Resource Centres at Namchi and Geyzing were sanctioned in 1994 but have been functional from the academic session 2010-11.

11.2: Functions of DIET

- 1. Conducts 2-year D.El.Ed course.
- 2. Conducts short term need based in-service training/Workshop especially at primary level to H.Ms & Primary Teachers.
- 3. Conducts Orientation programmes for other functionaries working for teacher education e.g., BRCs, CRCs, Aaganwadi workers, etc.
- 4. Monitors and supervises educational institutions in their jurisdiction.
- 5. Extends support for professional development of teacher educators.
- 6. Develops locally relevant Teaching Learning Materials (TLM), evaluation tools etc.
- 7. Develops training modules, curriculum and syllabus for in-service teacher training.
- 8. Extend support in writing text books, moderation & evaluation of questions.

11.3: Faculty and ministerial staff

DIET, Gangtok has fifteen (15) teaching faculty including the principal and twenty (20) ministerial staff. In addition to this there are four (4) part time faculty for four (4)

local languages i.e., Bhutia, Lepcha, Limboo & Nepali. The DIET teaching faculty is nonvacational as they have to impart short term in-service training programmes and conduct workshops to school teachers especially at primary level during vacations and as and when the lecturers are free from regular classes. Two faculty members are on study leave to pursue M.Ed. Degree for one year at Harka Maya College, Tadong, Gangtok and will be completing the course in July, 2015.

11.4: Curriculum

The institutes follow NCTE curriculum with little modification based on local needs. The curriculum and syllabus from the academic session 2011 have been designed as per the RTE Act 2009 and NCF for Teacher Education. The curriculum includes foundation course, pedagogy and school internship. Besides, Central Institute of Hindi (CIH), Agra organizes Hindi language awareness programme in two phases. First phase at the Institute for 16-20 days in the month of May and in the 2nd phase trainees are sent to CIH, Agra for advance course with same duration during the winter vacation. This programme is 100% sponsored by the CIH, Agra. This year 47 trainees (2nd Year) were deputed to CIH, Agra in the month of December 2014 with one escort from the Institute after obtaining approval of the government.

11.5: 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed).

The annual intake capacity for the pre-service 2-year D.El.Ed. programme is 50 numbers as per the NCTE norms.

As per the MHRD guidelines there is provision for exposure visits for the faculty to different DIETs across the country for exchange of knowledge and experiences. However, due to paucity of funds these exposure visits in the financial year 2014-15 could not materialise.

11.8: Distance education programme under IGNOU for D.El.Ed. course

In addition to the above mentioned programmes DIET, Gangtok, is also one of the study centers for distance education programme under IGNOU for D. El. Ed. course for untrained primary in-service teachers since 2013.

In 2012, 186 untrained primary teachers were enrolled in IGNOU for the D.El.Ed course. Out of 186 student teachers, 87 student teachers were enrolled at DIET, Gangtok. The remaining 99 teachers were enrolled in DRC Namchi, South Sikkim. A total of 77 primary teachers out of 87 completed the course in July 2014. In addition, 98 primary teachers were enrolled in January 2014 and 47 primary teachers of East & North enrolled in January 2015 at the study centre DIET, Gangtok and are undergoing the said course.

CHAPTER 12

CHAPTER 13

STATE INSTITUTE OF CAPACITY BUILDING (SICB)

13.1: Background

The establishment of a full-fledged State Institute of Capacity Building at Karfectar, Jorethang, South Sikkim in 2009 with the purpose of imparting training, transfer of knowledge and building stronger capacities of the unemployed youth was perceived with a visionary intent.

With the setting up of this Institute, the State has made significant inroads in solving the isuue of growing rate of unemployment amongst the youth of Sikkim. It has helped build self reliance in our youths who have imbibed values, life skills, and livelihood capabilities and are knowledgeable and assertive in demanding their rights in the work place – "Empowerment".

The Institute caters to all categories of youths from school dropouts, youths with different types of physical disabilities, in both urban and rural areas. The establishment of this institute is an inclusive state policy that focuses on holistic development of young people to shape their future. It is integrated into the government's policy planning frameworks, both in terms of strategic planning and resource allocation.

13.2: Livelihood schools (Li-School):

These are capacity building schools for the youths of Sikkim to enable them to sustain themselves economically and it is the first such scheme in the country. These schools are helping the unemployed youths of state to groom their talents so as to imbibe in them the ability to harness their skills and become self- reliant. The government policy gives preference to local resources and utilizse the services from all sectors including the government sector.

All the livelihood schools are functioning under the State Institute of Capacity Building, Karfectar, South Sikkim. The Institute and all affiliated Livelihood Schools are governed by a examining cum affiliating board i.e. State Board of Livelihood School, Sikkim (SBLSS) which has been notified vide Notification No. 246/GEN/DOP dated 09.04.2010, Government of Sikkim. The institute and livelihood schools have become centers for the youth to learn about their strengths and needs, to prepare for successful lives as adults, make choices about their futures and take up related training after which they may be able to build their careers. The Institute is satisfying the needs of youth development which include strategies related to academic development, delivering quality and standard based training, work skills and core value.

13.3: Activities of SICB from 01st April, 2014 to 31st March, 2015

The various activities undertaken by the institute between 01st April, 2014 to 31st March, 2015 are as below:-

- i. A three day "Training of Trainers" (TOT) was conducted at SICB for the trainers who are working in the livelihood schools. The trainers were educated about the livelihood school administration, classroom management, understanding National Skill Qualification Frame Work (NSQF), National Skill Development Agency(NSDA), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Various Sector Skill Councils (SSC),National Occupational Standards(NOS), Qualification Packs(QP) and Unit Planning, Preparation of Lesson plan as per NSQF, QP & NOS, working with new MIS and other office documents, preparation of question paper, lesson plan, question paper and question bank as per QP & NOS.
- ii. Dr. Thomas Chandy, IFS, Principal Secretary, HRDD visited the Upper-Tadong livelihood school, East Sikkim for Tally cum Computer Software course on 15/05/14. He inspected the class rooms & laboratory and also interacted with the undergoing Trainees and Staff members. He asked the trainees to utilize the facilities provided by the State Government up to its maximum extent and excel in their profession after successful completion of the course.
- iii. Paryavan Mahotasav (15th June to 30th of June) was celebrated in all livelihood schools and SICB as per the vision and mission of the State Government. The Mahotsav was organized to inculcate the awareness on "Mother Earth & its Environment" through the recognition of the bond of kinship with mother earth, nature and all the beings in it as well as to make each one understand and appreciate the value of the air they breathe, of the sun's rays that illumine the world, the drops of rain that sustain life on the Earth, and to spur them to PAY BACK TO MOTHER EARTH AND ITS NATURE through an individual's effort and dedication starting from our home and society and the world at large.
- iv. Further, a team of officers and staff conducted awareness programme through power point presentation related with various topics of environment at different livelihood schools located in East & North districts by Ms. T. Y. Bhutia (Jt. Chief Administrator), Dr. I. B. S. Yadav (Deputy Director) and in South & West districts by Shri S. K. Mothey (Jt. Chief Administrator), Mr. R. Rai (Deputy Director) & Mr. Dipesh Sharma (Research Analyst). The whole programme was conducted under the controlled guidance of Shri S. D. Dhakal, Chief Administrator, SICB.

- v. The Chief Administrator, Shri S.D.Dhakal along with the Joint Chief Administrators Shri Sunil Kumar Mothay and Miss Tenzin Yangchen Bhutia and Mr. RanjanRai, Deputy Director (Counselling, Placement and Examination) visited New Delhi and Ahmedabad from 14th July to 20th of July, 2014. The aim of the tour in New Delhi was to familiarize the officers to the newly constituted Skill Development Ministry along with Ministry of Youth Affairs, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region & Ministry of Rural Development as well as following up on the proposals submitted to earlier mentioned Ministries.
- vi. Further, the visit to Ahmedabad was conducted in order to interact with the placement organizations and to take stock of the trainees placed in the city as well as trainees undergoing Industrial training. The officers also attended a conference on Skills and Corporate Social Responsibility organized by Confederation of Indian Industries (C.I.I) on 18th July, 2014.The visiting officers called on the Hon'ble M.P, LokSabha, Shri P.D. Rai at his residence in New Delhi to brief him about the visits to the various ministries.
- vii. A cleanliness pledge "SafSafaiShapath" was administered to the officers and staff of the institute by Chief Administrator on 30.09.2014 to undertake the cleanliness activities in and around his/her place of residing/working for one hundred hour in a year or two hours per week.
- viii. An interview through Skype was conducted at SICB for the trainees of hair, beauty and spa course of SICB for their placements at Sohum Core Wellness Limited, Mumbai, Modi House, 3-D, C-10, Dalia Industrial Estate, Andheri, West Mumbai on 20th October, 2014. Similarly, a placement programme was also organized at Silliguri regarding the placement of successful trainees of Banking & BPO course of SICB on 23.10.14 in collaboration with B-ABLE (Basix Academy for Building Lifelong Employability),New Delhi.
 - ix. A meeting of officers of District Industries Centers (East/ West/ North & South), representative from KVIC, SKVDB, SICB and other stake holders were conducted on 07.07.14 in the chamber of Secretary, Commerce & Industry at Gangtok. It was decided to conduct entrepreneurship training programme to the trainees of livelihood schools trade wise and the resource persons will be provided by Commerce & Industry Department. Shri S. D. Dhakal, Chief Administrator, led the SICB team.
 - x. A detailed presentation about the various activities of the SICB was conducted on 11th November, 2014 during Public Information Campaign (PIC) at Melli ground by Dr. I.B.S. Yadav, Deputy Director (R&C). The programme was organized by Press Information Bureau (PIB), Government of India in collaboration with other media units of Ministry of Information & Broadcasting i.e. Doordarshan, All India Radio, Directorate of Field Publicity, (DFP), Directorate of Advertising and Visual publicity (DAVP) and Song & Drama Division.
 - xi. A two member's team of Tata Institute of Social Sciences conducted a survey regarding the trades, its placements and the performance of the trainees of livelihood schools. The team members interacted with the present & ex- trainees and the parents as well.

- xii. A memorandum of collaboration is signed on 27.11.2014 with Vinayaka Mission's Sikkim University (VMSU), Tadong, Gangtok in order to support the course design, examination, evaluation and certification of the programmes developed by SICB.
- xiii. Dr.I.B.S.Yadav, Deputy Director (R&C) participated in skill development workshop on 22nd December, 2014 at Shimla which was conducted by the Department of Planning & Finance, Government of Himachal Pradesh. He made a presentation regarding the innovative scheme in practice by the Government of Sikkim in the form of livelihood schools. Furthermore, Sikkim was invited as a special invitee to present the matter at the workshop.
- xiv. Shri SachchidanandaSwamiji of International Sivananda Yoga Vedanta Center, Madurai, Tamil Nadu visited the primary teachers training course running at SICB on 26th and 27th February, 2015. He interacted with the trainees and talked about child psychology, happiness and ultimately the love of teaching profession. He also conducted practical classes on Yoga through the practice of "asana postures", "breathing", "proper diet", "proper relaxation" and "positive thinking".
- xv. A delegation of members comprising of all the North-East states along with the representatives of National Skill Development Agency (NSDA), Government of India under the leadership of Shri J.P.Rai, Director General (NSDA) visited the Institute and Daramdin, Namchi-Singithang, Arithang, Syari and Upper- Tadong Livelihood Schools along with the Chief Administrator, Shri S.D.Dhakal and other officers of the SICB on 6th& 7th February,2015. The purpose behind this visit was to know the functioning and effectiveness of Livelihood School scheme in the state. The delegates interacted with the principal, teachers & trainees and were highly impressed with the functioning of the livelihood schools and congratulated the staff members for their dedication towards the development of skills of the trainees.
- xvi. On 17th February, 2015 Mr. Abhishek Lama, Branch Manager of the North Eastern Development Finance Corporation Ltd (NEDFi) "NEDFi House" G.S.Road, Dispur, Guwahati, Assam- PIN Code - 781006 along with two consultants visited the SICB. They interacted with the officers and enquired about the administration of livelihood schools, syllabus, examination and certifications of the courses.
- xvii. Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI), H-19, Lamb Road, Ambari, Guwahati organized a one day workshop cum orientation programme on "Quality Management on Bee-Keeping cum Honey Processing" to the trainees and progressive farmers on 23rd February, 2015 at SICB.
- xviii. A meeting with the Registrar, Dean, Principal of Arts & Science College of Vinayaka Missions Sikkim University, NH-10, Tadong, Gangtok and representatives of Institute was held on 07.03.2015 regarding implementation of "Working Arrangement" signed, syllabus/curriculum, design of courses, examination and evaluation of courses and trainees and for certification of courses running in livelihood schools.
 - xix. Shri S.D.Dhakal, Chief Administrator of Institute made a detailed presentation on the facilities, courses, placement and other akin services available in the Institute and its

affiliated livelihood schools especially for the female trainees on 26.03.2015. The presentation was made in front of the delegates of Women Council of India who were on a visit to the State.

- xx. A workshop cum seminar on "Awareness, Motivation & Technology Transfer for Development of Bee Keeping in Sikkim" was organized on 30th& 31st, March, 2015 at the Conference Hall of the SICB. The programme was organized by High-Tech Natural Products (India) Limited in association with SICB and the Community Friendly Movement (CFM),5 K,1st Floor, Jungi House, ShapurJat ,New Delhi-110049.The programme was sponsored by the National Bee Board, Department of Agriculture, Government of India, New Delhi.
- xxi. A Research Paper on "Livelihood Schools- An Initiative towards Economic Empowerment in Sikkim" was presented by Mr. Dipesh Sharma along with Mr. G.R. Subba, Assistant Director (Under the guidance of Dr. IBS Yadav, Deputy Director) at Shillong on 26.03.2015 during a seminar. The seminar was organized by Indian Council of Social Science Research North East Center- North East Hill University (NEHU), Shillong, Meghalaya in collaboration with V.V.Giri National Labour Institute, Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India, New Delhi.

13.4: Success stories

 :Mr. Jas Bahadur Chettri a trainee of Khamdong-Singtam Livelihood School, East Sikkim of Driver cum Tour Guide Course (Batch No.10) originally hailing from Rangang-Yangang constituency bought a Maruti Van Euro-3 vehicle after saving money while driving a private vehicle from Entel show room Gangtok. Presently, he is carrying students from his place of residing (Namphok) to Yangang Senior Secondary School every day and earning his livelihood.



- Malati Subba: A trainee of Rinchenpong Livelihood School, West Sikkim for Homestay Tourism course has successfully started a homestay at her residence as Mahimalaya Homestay at Jaubari, Kaluk and had already hosted eight (8) domestic tourists & one(1) international tourist at her house.
- Muna Devi Sharma: Similarly, she was also one of the trainees of the above mentioned Livelihood School. She had opened her homestay at Karthok, Rinchenpong named as Namrek Homestay. She has already hosted one international client and successfully managed rice-planting event at her field for her clients.
- Mr. Rajiv Rai: Mr. Rajiv Rai who was a trainee 3rd batch (2013-14) of Namcheybong Livelihood School, East Sikkim for hospitality services course has been placed as the overall Operational Manager of Cherry Resort, Namchi. It is a 3 star category property owned by the Tourism & Civil Aviation Department, Government of Sikkim. Presently his monthly remuneration is Rs. 15000/- per month with free meal & lodging.

- Ms. JoshikaRai, a trainee of Namchi-Singithang Livelihood School, South Sikkim of Cutting & Tailoring course has started her own enterprise at Namchi and earning her livelihood successfully with the machine provided by the Government during the training period.
- Ms. DorjeeOngmuLepcha, a trainee of Lachen-Mangan Livelihood School, North Sikkim of Hospitality Services course (1st Batch)a resident of MallingSinghik, Mangan, got selected in a Reputed Chain Hotel named "Blue Saphire Clarks Inn, Haldwani, Uttarakhand" as a Receptionist in Front Office Department with a starting salary of Rs. 5,000/- pm with free accommodation and food. After working for a year, she returned to Sikkim and started working with Denzong Regency with a better salary due to her past work experience. Presently, she is working as a "Computer Operator" for Tourism Office under Asia Development Bank (ADB), with a salary of Rs.12, 000/- per month.
- Mr. EnothRai, a Trainee (1st batch) of Namcheybong Livelihood School, East Sikkimfor Hospitality & Tourism Management has startedhis own Tours & Travels and Home Stay at his village town in Assam Linzey. He is doing good business. Now, he is aiming to expand his business in the days to come.
- Similarly, Miss. Passang Sherpa, trainee (2nd batch) from Namcheybong Livelihood School, East Sikkim for Hospitality & Tourism Management, a permanent resident of Chujachen, under Rongli Sub-division has started Village Tourism activities. Today, she has influenced her community members to participate in this socially amicable trade. She has merged herself with the varied activities related to Village Tourism. She had started a home stay at her private dwelling house and organizing cultural shows, local sightseeing, bird watching, trekking etcwith the help of her community members of the locality.
- Mr. Purna Rai, a trainee of Soreng-Chakhung Livelihood School of agriculture and horticulture related course has started a small business at Jorethang and Chakung bazaar. He sells different types of flowers on haat days. He prepares different types of compost at his home like Panchakavya, Vermi-Compost, Cow Pit Pat (C.P.P), Bokashi etc. He also started rearing goats and cows which is the beginning of a small farm.
- Mr. SantamanSubba, a trainee of Kabi-Lungchok Livelihood School (Batch II) has established his own poultry farm. Initially, he raised 100 number of birds and now he has increased the number of birds and wants to make poultry farming as his main source of income for life. He is basically from Lingdok, East Sikkim and an Arts Graduate.

13.6: On job training/ industrial training

-) The Trainees of Namcheybong Livelihood School, East Sikkim for hospitality services course were deputed to undergoing six months of industrial training programme at various under Sarovar group of Hotels, Hyderabad. The Industrial Training programme ended on the 27th of July, 2014. During the programme, trainees were exposed to all four major departments of a hotel viz. front office, housekeeping, food and beverage service and food production (Kitchen).
-) The Trainees of Gnathong-Machong Livelihood School, East Sikkim for automobile repairing course were deputed to undergo their six months industrial training at various workshops located within State. The trainees were tested on various skills learnt and developed during the industrial training. Some of the trainees were held back at the workshops for observance till August 2015. If satisfied with their performance, the trainees would be placed at these workshops.
-) A group of 32 (thirty two) trainees of Lachen-Mangan Livelihood School, East Sikkim for Hospitality Services Course have been selected and deputed for their 6 (six) months Industrial Training(IT) at The ITC future Landmark, Indore(5 star), Madhya Pradesh (12 girls & 3 boys) and The Golden Palms Resort, Bangalore (4 star), Karnataka (11 girls & 6 boys).The trainees were escorted by the centre's head and assistant trainer of the school on 21st of January, 2015 from Sikkim.
